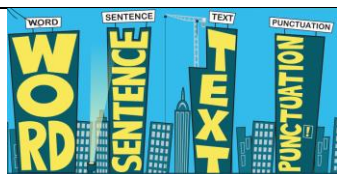













Reading

	<p><u>Writing</u> If possible, please encourage your child to do some writing during their time at home. This could be related to any of our school topics or it could just be something your child is interested in or writing for a specific purpose E.g. write a letter to a friend.</p>
	<p><u>Maths</u> White Rose Maths This is the scheme of work we follow at Robertswood for teaching maths. They are shortly due to release free resources, for access from home. These would be our recommended resources to use as they will complement the teaching approach we use in school. They also have 'Challenge of the Day' and 'Flashback 4' resources, which we use in school as morning starters, so will be recognisable to the children.</p> <p>First4Maths You can create your own free online account and download the Year 6 activity booklet, which has 20 days worth of creative, at-home maths activities to choose from. The document has also been attached to this email.</p>
	<p><u>Science</u> Discovery Education (Espresso) These are the topics that we have covered so far, that children could revise.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Light and Shadows - Evolution - Classification - Digital Microscope (not a unit we have done, but does link to themes studied and has a range of interesting content).
	<p><u>History</u> Discovery Education (Espresso) - The Second World War (either revise areas we have already studied or find out more about areas we have not yet taught: Anne Frank, the Holocaust and VE Day).</p> <p>Twinkl - World War Two Unit Pack (the role of women in World War Two and the holocaust are areas of learning to focus on as they have not yet been covered in school).</p> <p>Children could also finish reading and/or watch the film of Goodnight Mister Tom (as mentioned in the termly newsletter, this film is a PG).</p>

	<p><u>Geography</u> Discovery Education (Espresso) - Rivers (a wide range of videos, activities, fact files and images that can be looked at to further enhance the learning recently started on rivers).</p>
	<p><u>Computing</u> Twinkl - Scratch Animated Stories Year 6 Unit Pack (this will guide the children through a series of lessons, helping them to develop their coding skills). Scratch is coding software that is free to download. GarageBand This is free software (but only available on Apple devices) that we have been using in school. Children can enjoy creating and editing their own music.</p>
	<p><u>French</u> Twinkl - This is France! Unit Pack (we have covered lesson 1 – Les Voisins, but have not yet covered the following lessons on Paris, directions, distances, famous people and nationalities).</p>
	<p><u>Design & Technology</u> We were due to design and make a vegetarian soup in our final two weeks of term; whilst at home, you could try making a vegetable soup. We would love to hear how you got on – you could even take photos.</p>
	<p><u>P.E.</u> Where possible, take the opportunity to enjoy the great outdoors. Did you know that The National Trust will, where possible, open as many of its gardens and parks for free? Go Noodle There are a wide range of fun activities to keep you moving that can be done indoors, in front of a screen.</p>
	<p>TTS Home Learning This is a curriculum-focused independent learning resource with over 40 home-learning activities all planned and all prepared.</p>
	<p>We are aware that you and your children may be feeling anxious at this time and therefore we would like to encourage a focus on your child’s wellbeing and emotional health. The resources above provide guidance for activities you could do with your child during the school closure, however please do not underestimate the value of learning through play, art activities and outdoor learning (wherever possible).</p>
