

It is important that your grant is used effectively and based on school need. Under the <u>Quality of Education criteria</u> (p41) inspectors consider the extent to which schools can articulate their curriculum (INTENT), construct their curriculum (IMPLEMENTATION) and demonstrate the outcomes which result (IMPACT).


