How to Enter

All artists in the Greater Kansas City area are invited to enter their mental health-related artwork for inclusion in the stART the conversation art exhibition. Artists will be required to submit an entry form for each piece of artwork they wish to have displayed. Artists under the age of 18 must complete the following youth entry form. A separate form is available for artists 18 and older. **Entry forms must be submitted no later than Friday, April 25**.

All artwork entries must be dropped off at either 7840 Washington Avenue or 757 Armstrong Avenue no later than Friday, May 9, unless alternative drop-off arrangements are made with event organizers. Completed entry forms may be dropped off along with artwork or submitted via email to communications@wyandotbhn.org no later than Friday, May 9th.

The stART the conversation art exhibit is open to a variety of art forms, including paintings, sculptures and performance art pieces, provided we can accommodate the artwork's needs in our exhibition space. Informed Consent Form

Purpose:

stART The conversation is an art exhibition by Wyandot Behavioral Health Network (Wyandot BHN) to raise awareness of and destigmatize mental health. This exhibition is rooted in the empowerment of people with lived experience in the mental health system. The artwork displayed in this exhibition belongs to the artist. The artwork will be dropped off for exhibition and picked up at an agreed upon date. It is also required to complete an art entry form for each artwork entered. While the purpose of this exhibition is empowerment, advocacy, and destigmatization, you are encouraged to consider the risks, benefits, and how the public consumption of your artwork may impact your mental health.

Risks:

Artwork is deeply personal and may explore sensitive topics and experiences. Wyandot BHN cannot guarantee who will be present at the exhibition or how your artwork will be perceived by the public. In the public space, people may take photographs or videos of your work that may be posted online or in other public media spaces. In past years, the exhibition has garnered attention from local news outlets. This may result in news outlets speaking about/videotaping/photographing your artwork exhibited. While artworks are accepted from all community members, display of your artwork in an exhibition by Wyandot BHN may result in assumptions about you being a client of Wyandot BHN, resulting in confidentiality risks. Wyandot BHN offers no warranty and will accept no responsibility or liability for any claims, damages, losses, expenses, costs, or other general liabilities that may occur to artwork or personal property before, during or after said event. All participants accept responsibility for the care of any art whether displayed or not.

Benefits:

The mission of this exhibition is to lift up diverse perspectives, engage our community in honest conversation about mental health, create change, and raise awareness through art. Participation can be a healing and empowering experience. You may find yourself empowered, validated, and supported by the conversations and reactions to your artwork. This may result in feelings of fulfillment and purpose and an increase in self-esteem, self-worth, and self-acceptance. This exhibition could also be utilized as an opportunity to be better known by your support network and community. The exhibition of your artwork may empower others who relate to your work to open up about their own experiences.
