OUR HISTORY

A long tradition exists of early Māori use of the wider Taiari area (later becoming known as the Strath Taieri) as both an access corridor for the inland Otago as well as for gathering mahika kai. Ngāi Tahu traditions speak of the abundance of tuna (eel) and kanakana (lamprey) along with various species of moa. Rock shelters and other areas of special significance are located here. They are sacred and protected being of major cultural importance holding the memories, traditions and history of our Ngāi Tahu ancestors. The kaitiaki Runaka (guardians) for the area are Kati Huirapa Runaka ki Puketeraki and Te Runanga o Otakau.

More recently, Strath Taieri's steeped history includes the expansive pastoral runs of the 1850s, the gold rush era of the 1860s and following on from this, the completion of the Otago Central Railway in the 1890s. The railway linked Dunedin, the then country's largest city, to the goldfields. This method of transportation continued to provide a link for both economic and cultural life throughout Central Otago, bringing essential supplies to one of the countries most isolated regions for many years to come. To this day there are many heritage sites/buildings to enjoy throughout the area. The <u>Middlemarch Museum</u> is an excellent resource to learn more about our history.



TAIERI RIVER

The Taieri is a large river that holds a good stock of brown trout throughout its length. It offers a wide diversity of terrain and water that makes it suitable for all angling methods and skill levels. Fishing Licence required. See link for access maps and information:

LAKE MAHINERANGI

Lake Mahinerangi is a large man-made lake formed when the Waipori river was dammed for hydroelectricity generation. The lake is well stocked with brown trout and some perch. The elevation is nearly 2,000 feet (610m) and the lake can be very windswept and cold, which makes the fishing best suited to warmer months. Fishing Licence required. 
