OUR MISSION STATEMENT

To assist military personnel at Camp Pendleton and to serve their families by providing financial, educational and social enrichment programs as they face the unique challenges of military life while standing ready to selflessly defend our country. We will inspire and encourage members of the community to join us as we honor, support and show appreciation to the Marines, Sailors and their families and will afford opportunities for the community to do so through various outreach programs throughout the year.

It's often called "The Forgotten War," but one day a year is set aside to remind Americans of those who served and died in the conflict -- Korean War Veterans Armistice Day on July 27.

The Korean War started on June 25, 1950, when North Korea suddenly started rolling tanks across the 38th parallel. The communist assault was initially successful. For the first two months of the war, the North Koreans easily pushed the South Korean and American forces back toward Pusan, nearly into the Sea of Japan.

After it recovered from the surprise, the United States set up a perimeter around Pusan to hold the communists at bay. It began to mass men, vehicles and aircraft to push back. U.S. troops under Gen. Douglas MacArthur landed at Inchon, far behind the North Korean line, sending the communist force into disarray.

Eventually, 21 countries formed a United Nations force that pushed the North Koreans back past the 38th parallel; captured the enemy capital at Pyongyang; and nearly fought them to the Yalu River -- the North's border with China. Then, the Chinese entered the war.

A massive Chinese Army crossed the river and surprised the U.S. and South Korean forces, overwhelming them and pushing them back to the 38th parallel at great human cost. That was just the first four months of the war.

The next two years saw the fighting devolve into a bloody stalemate along the 38th parallel. It ground on in a war of attrition along the front while U.N. airpower mercilessly bombed North Korea's cities and infrastructure in an attempt to force the communists to a position of weakness during long-running peace talks.

It was at 10 a.m. on July 27, 1953, that two years and 17 days of negotiations finally ended three years of brutal fighting on the Korean Peninsula. (from military.com)





The month of July has special importance for veterans. July 4th, Independence Day, is the first thing some think about where summertime veteran holidays are concerned, but National Hire A Veteran Day is just as important for some, at least where the (post-retirement or separation) future of America's military population is concerned.

National Hire a Veteran Day will next be observed on Monday, July 25, 2022. The day is first and foremost a call to action for employers and is recognized and promoted by federal agencies including, to name a few, the Department of Labor and the Department of Veterans Affairs.

Since 2017, July 25th is observed as National Hire A Veteran Day. Founded by Marine Corps veteran Dan Caporale (who also founded Hire Our Heroes), Hire A Veteran Day is meant as a call to action for those who hire and those who apply.

2017 was also the year that the Honoring Investments in Recruiting and Employing American Military Veterans Act of 2017 (HIRE Vets Act) was passed.

Veterans bring much to the bargaining table at job application time; dedication, teamwork, an emphasis on good communication, and pride in the work done.

IN MEMORIAM July 30, 2020



July 30, 2020 - A day that started like so many others but ended in a nightmare for the 15th MEU, the United States Marine Corps and for all Americans. A training mission in an AAV that went horribly wrong, resulting in the deaths of 9 heroes - 8 Marines and 1 Sailor. Young men who saw a bigger purpose than themselves and who so selflessly served, knowing that it was possible that they would pay the ultimate price for the freedoms we all enjoy. Taken far too young, far too soon - it is the cost of freedom that too many forget is so high. Reading the story of each service member is painful but we can **NEVER** forget !!!


