Principal's Update

Our numbers are really good, we are filled to capacity with over 470 students!

- Special Ed numbers are high. Caseload for elementary should be 19 and we have 1 special ed teacher, 1 para with 28 special ed students. This number may increase.
 - The district will provide a sub daily. On October 1 the district takes a count and levels staffing across schools in response to the actual student numbers/need.
- English Language Learner teacher district allocation may increase, which would free up the .25 salary Principal Williams allocated from his budget.
- The new superintendent has had a great start and has been visible across the district at schools, nutrition staff kick-off, and teacher PD.
- The food services lead at RHS retired last week. The district is seeking a replacement but currently subs are rotating through.

Treasurer's Report

 - Grade level books: Seeking permission to allocate \$500/class for books.
 - Looking at resurfacing the gaga pit and adding shade trees to the playground.
 - The sign fund is available for regular spending if needed.
 - Putting away the money for a potential new sign is assuming that we won't get a building upgrade in the next 4 years, which is unknown. Once the RHS building is on the list for improvements, that would be a huge project and signage would be included.
