
## Operationalizing Intersectionality Theory in Research

- 1. What potential differences can be teased out of your sample population?
  - a. Adopt relevant PPV (use the provided template)
    - Select social categories of identity that are relevant to the broader context of your research
  - b. Adopt PP<sub>v</sub> (use the provided template)
    - Tease out differences within each PPV
    - Further reduce PP<sub>v</sub> when possible (e.g. within the (dis)ability PPV, can each PP<sub>v</sub> be further divided?
    - Include differences with regional significance (e.g. provincial and national level differences)
- 2. Is your research team reflective of the diversity in the sampling frame(work)?
- 3. What organizations exist that could become partners in the research and promote community engagement? Does your research align with work already being done by these organizations?
- 4. Do members of the research team have existing relationships with communities that are in the sampling framework and historically underrepresented?
  - How can those relationships be leveraged?
  - How can those relationships be strengthened?
  - How can new relationships be created by doing research in collaboration with community stakeholder partners?
