In Remembrance Of Friends

On the longest night of the year, December 21st, Crossroads Mission holds its annual Friends Memorial service. The event is dedicated to remembering those who died as a result of homelessness or addiction, friends who served at Crossroads Mission, and other friends and family.

This year's memorial was initiated by Treatment Director Cesar Acosta, with the assurance that even through this sad moment, we take comfort in the hope found in Jesus.

Crossroads Mission's friend Fabian Valenzuela gave a powerful message that Jesus is not waiting for perfection, but for his name to be called upon, and that if all feels hopeless, accepting Christ into your heart can bring peace.

The names of those being remembered would be called out afterwards, announced by New Way Counselor Lola Phillips and Outreach Coordinator Sergio Valle. With every name given, a bell was rung, a candle was lit, and a cross

with their name was placed upon the wall of the Family Shelter with help from staff. In the end, 307 names were called that night; names that will be remembered by staff, program participants, friends, and family of Crossroads Mission.

As the service concluded with a final song of "Amazing Grace," guests were encouraged to approach the wall of the Family Shelter to take the cross with their friend or loved one's name on it.

We thank you for all your generosity and support, for you make these memorials possible. We hope to continue remembering

those who have passed from addiction or homelessness, and to continue inspiring the unconditional love of Jesus Christ.

Angel: God's Love In

Angel's battle with addiction began at a very early age, in her teen years. During Junior High, she began to experiment with drugs, mostly to party and hang out with her friends. However, the drug usage soon spiraled out of control throughout the years with more servery.

Her addiction began to develop

to such a point that it began to create problems within her family. During her parents' divorce, she stayed in Yuma, Arizona, with her father while her mother and brother moved to California. As her drug use increased, her parental support ended, as she kept asking for money to feed her habit. Angel also allowed unsafe people into her father's home, who stole from the family.

After many years of addiction, she struggled to keep a job or housing. Her drug use was overpowering any sense of control she could have over her life's decisions.

Eventually, Angel got arrested, and was sent to Crossroads Mission through

Drug Court. In hindsight, she states this was the best course of action to save her life.

"Probation saved my life by sending me to Crossroads Mission."

In 2011, she entered the New Life program, where individuals can work to overcome their addiction and recover both physically and spiritually. At that time, she was not interested in faith-based exercises Crossroads had to offer, or learning about the Bible, only to be done.

Even as she completed the program, she later relapsed and found herself back at Crossroads Mission while on probation. This time, however, Angel returned with newfound determination. She had the will to fully commit to the program and her recovery, as well as focus on her faith. Learning about Jesus Christ became her main goal alongside recovery. She attended chapel, joined Bible studies, and stayed involved. This religious experience gave her the

foundation she needed to recover and rebuild her life.

"Crossroads Mission has introduced me to God ... which has been just a journey in my life and such a transformation in all I do."

After graduating from the New Life program, Angel's life began to improve immensely. She found stable housing, stayed successful on probation, got her rights restored, and continued to volunteer at Crossroads Mission, where she was later employed at. She also joined a church, where she has been a member for five years and now serves as Treasurer.

As of 2026, she is now 10 years clean and sober. She met her husband back in 2011 and has now built a loving and stable home with him and his two sons. They have lived in the same home for about ten years now, and Angel shares how grateful they are to be able to pay their bills, own vehicles, and enjoy a steady life together. She continues to attend

church weekly with her family and stays involved in faith-based ministries in the Yuma community.

Today, Angel uses her story to encourage others who are struggling with addiction. She knows taking the first step can be scary, but she believes it is worth it for that second chance.

"I know it may be scary, but in the end, I'm telling you, it'll be the best thing you do for your life."

She states that having an environment with other people trying to change and trying to overcome their addictions for a new life helps you achieve your goals. Even if you are scared, there will always be help for you to get back on your feet. Angel also encourages the community to support Crossroads Mission by coming down to volunteer and see how change is real, and to please continue to pray for those in need.

Angel's journey is a powerful reminder that second chances are real, how having faith, support,


and courage to recover can be guided by the hand of God, His love, and His forgiveness.

Crossroads Mission held its Annual Road to Recovery conference from October 24th to the 25th, with the goal of showing those struggling with addiction that change and recovery is possible. The conference focuses on physical, mental, and spiritual recovery. Faith in Jesus over fear of the physical world is one of the main messages of this conference.

The first day started on a cool Friday afternoon, where a sobriety countdown was given. People walked up to the stage to celebrate the years, months, days, or hours of sobriety they held. Up next was guest speaker Dr. Robert Ornelas,

who sang and preached on the changes God has made in his life, filling the afternoon with dancing and singing from the attending guests and staff.

The next day held workshops such as Alcoholics Anonymous, Narcotics Anonymous, and Art for Recovery for guests to attend. These were later followed by a discussion panel, certificates, and lunch with information booths. It was a great way to start or continue recovery.

We thank everyone who made this event possible, and helped us show that the *Road to Recovery* is always possible with God.

Board Spotlight: Mark R.

Mark Reynolds has been involved with Crossroads Mission for many years before being on the Board of Directors. Since 2011, he began his involvement on the Board after his retirement, being called to do much more. Before that, he had been volunteering at Crossroads Mission since 1996, leading Bible studies to program participants and guests.

Over the years, Mark has served as Chairman of the Board twice. He was past Chairman in 2025. Currently, he is the Chairman of the Fundraising Committee which focuses in helping prepare for the Mission's annual fundraisers. The Board helps oversee the Mission's work, supports the staff in any way they can, and helps keep the organization running smoothly.

Mark has seen many lives changed through the Mission. He has watched people heal not just physically, but spiritually as well. He believes that Crossroads Mission plays an important role in helping people recover from drug and alcohol addiction by teaching them about the Bible and about God.

At first, he did not want to teach Bible studies, but his pastor encouraged him to sign up. Once he started, he fell in love with it when he saw the impact it had on others. He believes this is the work God has called him to do.

Mark often explains

that while freedom from addiction is important for life now, faith can impact your eternal one.

“Getting off drugs and alcohol is great for this life, but the gospel is even better for eternity.”

Mark and his wife, Sue, were both widowed before finding each other. They built a life together and have four children, three girls and one boy from their previous marriages. He feels truly blessed to see his children succeed in life.

Looking ahead, Mark hopes to see Crossroads Mission grow. His goals are to see the construction of the Center of Hope men's shelter building, to continue teaching the gospel to those in need, and continue to provide shelter, food, and care for the homeless, the poor, and the addicted.

Mark wants to encourage others to learn about the Mission. He believes it is a vital part of helping the homeless and those struggling with addiction in Yuma. His message to the community is simple: come visit to learn and see God's work being done at the Crossroads Mission.


