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DID YOU KNOW?

The Adriatik Hotel itself is an important part of Albanian history. Before 1990, people visiting the Adriatik were scanned in advance by the Albanian government. It was the only destination in Durrës for foreign personalities and Albanians.



Living in Tirana, my holidays at the Adriatic are short, but frequent. It's an ideal solution for the family. It's hard to arrive in Durrës, at the entrance of the Adriatik, and not find a sunny day. The advantage of the weather allows you to enjoy every environment-inside, outside, in the beach area, in the indoor and outdoor bars, in the spa, and in the sea-water pool, one of the hotel's treasures.

The ritual of my children is now established, between the hurried dropping of bags in the room and the collection of towels, like trophies for the holiday. I often joke with them, saying, "don't wander off into the unknown." They are so enthusiastic and eager to enjoy all the services and environments of the hotel that you can only follow them with your eyes from one area to another, from the indoor pool to the outdoor one, or from the pool to the children's area. Our little one enjoys another activity very dear to him-making pizzas with the kids. Preparing a

pizza, baking it with the assistance of the staff, and then eating the pizza you made yourself, is one of the most important projects for a child, as they get to taste, in the truest sense of the word, the results of their work.

The spaces, facilities, and tranquility provided allow each of us to engage in activities independently. While the adults enjoy an aperitif, the children have fun with their activities. To return to the difference between a 5-star hotel and others, I come back to the colors, but not only that. The lobby of Hotel Adriatik is a 24hour open exhibition of Albanian culture and history. The photographs of Marubi tell of the culture, clothing, and lifestyle of the Albanian elite over the past 100 years. In the photos of events at Hotel Adriatik over the years, import-







ant local and foreign personalities appear. The Adriatik Hotel itself is an important part of Albanian history. There you find exactly what you would want as part of the diaspora-the warmth of the Albanian people, but also the quality of service. To quell the longing for the country, there are vests and traditional clothing pieces that lead you to the offices of Albanian Tours located within the hotel, where you can choose your preferred guide for travels throughout Albania or the Balkans. Often, even I, who live in Albania, miss the short Albanian traditions... As a preferred destination, I have seen Adriatik as an opportunity to engage in activities that I pursue with my commitments. One of them is the Women Startup Competition. We held the

An event that went very well and without stress for me, due to the meticulous care of the hotel's events department. This allowed me to host and welcome my invited friends, including foreigners and those from the diaspora.

> But, as we Albanians say, one thing leads to another, and on the eve of Christmas, I take a step I hadn't even thought of before. With the income in Albania, few can take on hosting 16 people for Christmas Eve, who can also sleep in a 5-star hotel. At least not a journalist. But at Adriatik, once you are a guest, you are always a friend. After a conversation with the General Manager, I booked for my small and large family (16 people on Christmas Eve). Arranging the rooms for my nephews and nieces, along with my children, on the floor where the reserved rooms were located, exploring each other's rooms to see who had the best one, descending for dinner, enthusiastic and a bit chaotic, reminded us of a big family from the movie "Home Alone," who set off on a Christmas trip. Of course, we didn't forget anyone at home \bigcirc . We were all in the hotel, enjoying the holidays, a delicious dinner at a large table, and a royal breakfast, united and filled with love.



LONG ALBANIA'S RIVERS BY ALTEA YZEIRAJ

Albania has quickly become popular as one of Europe's top rafting destinations. Having rivers flowing through the rugged Balkan landscape, the country provides for many opportunities on exciting whitewater rafting adventures. From the fast rapids of Vjosa to the calmer floats along the Osumi, rafting Albania's rivers promises adventures unlike anywhere else.





The canyon of Langarica, that of Holta in Gramsh and Osum, always past the period of June and obtaining the necessary means, are fantastic for on foot and by swimming.

CHOOSING A REPUTABLE RAFTING COMPANY

Several rafting outfitters operate in Albania, but travelers should be careful on selecting based on experience, safety practices and environmental responsibility around these delicate areas. Albania Rafting Group leads the scene with expert multilingual guides, high-quality gear, extensive safety measures, and small groups. They focus closely on each client's skills and preferences to create a customized adventure.

BEST CONDITIONS FROM SPRING TO SUMMER

Seeing how the mountain snow and rain swell Albania's rivers, the ideal rafting months are April to early July. During this period, pleasant weather accompanied by sunshine enhances the experience of sparkling turquoise waters flowing through emerald canyons. Outfitters recommend booking spring rafting trips well in advance due to high demand. For rafters of all skill levels seeking Albania's exhilarating rivers, the country tempts with gorgeous scenery, heart-racing rapids, hospitable villages and a commitment to conservation—the recipe for a legendary Balkan adventure.



THE VJOSA RIVER STANDS OUT

The most popular river for rafting in Albania is Vjosa, also considered one of Europe's last remaining wild rivers. Starting high up in the Pindus Mountains near Greece, Vjosa flows freely for 270 kilometers, fueled by mountain snow and spring rains. The resulting rapids represent a challenge to even very experienced rafters due to their nonstop intensity. The sections near Tepelene are known for some of Albania's most difficult Class IV rapids, while beginners can harden their skills around Permet. Beyond the rapids, Vjosa impresses visitors due to its untouched wilderness beauty and conservation efforts.

In the Vjosa river, adventure enthusiasts get the chance to go Kayaking, Packrafting and Hydrospeeding.

MANY RIVERS TO EXPLORE

While Vjosa gets a lot of buzz, Albania has many suitable rivers for rafting trips catering to different abilities. The Langarica, Shala and Osumi Rivers offer smoother rafting with fun rapids between beautiful canyons and forest gorges. Trips on these rivers go past old Ottoman bridges, quiet mountain villages, and stunning emerald swimming holes to relax. Visitors enjoy the warm hospitality shown by locals in riverside towns who share homemade wine and traditional food.

Rivers suitable for rafting other than Vjosa would be:

- The 3 million year old canyons of Osum, only 60 km from the ancient city of Berat (January-June)
- Kayak and pack rafting in the canyons of Osum July-October Canyon Exploring via swim and hike July-October
- Bistrica river in Saranda
- Black Drin in Peshkopia, Dibra district up North (year round)
- Shkumbin in Elbasan (March-June)

Langarica Canyon and Shala river are not suitable for rafting.


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ALBANIA'S HISTORIC FORTRESS AND CULTURAL TREASURE

Standing prominently atop a hill overlooking Berat lies the impressive Berat Castle, its sturdy stone ramparts and towers exuding history. This ancient citadel provides valuable insights into Albania's complex past, from Illyrian times through the Byzantine and Ottoman eras, earning it UNESCO World.



Despite conquests and transformations over centuries, the steadfast Berat Castle remains a meaningful emblem of Albanian resilience as well as cultural continuity worth spending time within.



HERITAGE STATUS

Beyond the rich history, visitors also discover lovely views, artistic gems and long standing local traditions woven into everyday life.

ORIGINS BLEND FACTS AND LORE

Evidence indicates fortified structures existed since the 4th century BCE. Some credit Emperor Justinian with building defenses in the 6th century AD to control the strategic location. Mythic tales also suggest Helen of Troy's brother constructed the citadel to protect the princess after her kidnapping. While the actual beginnings remain uncertain, the stories hint at the site's antiquity.

CONQUERED YET NEVER CONCEDED


Through history, the fortress withstood numerous attacks and seizures which steadily expanded its structures. The Byzantines, Venetians, Bulgarians and Ottomans held the stronghold for periods. Their respective influences show through towers, churches, mosques and buildings visible today. Despite the armies passing through, the defiant castle endured.

LAYERS OF DIVERSE ARCHITECTURE

Wandering the grounds reveals epochs of history through the range of architecture. See the 13th century Holy Trinity Church, 15th century Ottoman-built Red and White Mosques, and the large 18th century merchant Qesarakio house. Turning any corner may uncover a Romaniote synagogue, old cistern, or modest artisan home.

BREATHTAKING VANTAGE POINTS

The high Mangalem viewpoint provides superb 180° views of the town, river and mountains. Equally impressive is the sunset overlook above the historic quarters, best enjoyed from a cafe with local wine as amber light blankets the scenery. These spots offer photographers wonderfully inspiring shots.





LIVING CULTURE WITHIN **THE CITADEL**

Remarkably, some 600 residents still dwell inside the Berat Castle boundaries. Witness everyday life - women baking bread, craftsmen playing trades, children playing lively games along the aged lanes. This community spirit prevails through festivals like the traditional Carnival parade held before Lent each year.





ONUFRI MUSEUM'S ALBANIAN SACRED ART

Within the castle walls lies the Onufri Museum, dedicated to the influential 16th century religious iconographer sharing its name. Visitors admire his ornate crosses. saint depictions, and delicate silver Christian and Islamic spiritual artifacts alongside contemporaries.



ALBANIAN constal city RICH WITH ANTIQUITY

On Albania's western coast along the Adriatic Sea rests the port city of Durrës, one of the Mediterranean's most continuously inhabited urban areas with nearly 3,000 years of history. Once an illustrious naval base and trade hub nurtured by Greeks, Romans, Byzantines and Venetians in turn, remnants of each glorious age litter Durrës. Beyond the visible antiquity, discover a thriving contemporary city renowned for vibrant culture, relic-filled museums, restored amphitheaters, medieval fortresses, delectable seafood, and nearby stretches of spectacular golden sand beaches kissing some of Europe's clearest waters.

THE STORIED ANCIENT PORT OF EPIDAMNOS/DYRRACHIUM

Founded in 627 BCE by colonists from Corinth and Corcyra, the city flourished as a strategic Adriatic base. Under Greek influence as Epidamnos, it minted coins by the 4th century BCE and nurtured the arts. Conquered in 229 BCE by invading Illyrian tribes and later seized by Rome in 168 BCE, the renamed Dyrrachium blossomed further. Julius Caesar himself temporarily ruled here for a stint. As the western terminus point for the vital Via Egnatia overland trade route linking Rome to Byzantium, Dyrrachium's wealth and prestige swelled. Remnants of ancient Greek defensive walls, cemeteries and the later Roman architecture astonish visitors today.



AMPHITHEATERS OLD AND NEW

Of the Roman relics scattered through Durres, none compare to the magnificence of the 2nd century CE amphitheater constructed to seat 15,000-20,000 spectators. Though partly ruined and occasionally used as a medieval quarry for stone, enough soaring arches, carved columns and vaulted passageways remain to inspire awe. In the modern day, the theater comes alive each summer with the Durrës International Film SummerFest using the antique backdrop for screenings and concerts. For year-round entertainment, the open-air Durrës Amphitheater built in 2011 hosts concerts and performing arts.



LAYERS OF HISTORY WITHIN THE ARCHAEOLOGICAL MUSEUM

While ruins capture attention outdoors, the Durrës Archaeological Museum displays tangible history indoors through artifacts from ancient times onwards. Showcases feature exquisite Hellenistic and Roman era mosaics, sculpture fragments, glassware, jewelry pieces and utilitarian objects, all beautifully preserved. Standouts include the Kangellar mosaic depicting a court musician, and unusual Roman bathhouse heating systems. Upstairs, find local medieval, Ottoman and modern era art, textiles and photography.

THE MEDIEVAL DURRËS CASTLE AND VENETIAN TOWER

Though the initial foundations of Durrës Castle likely stem from Byzantine times, the main extant fortification dates to the Anjevin occupation in the late 13th/early 14th century. Strategically positioned along the coastline for monitoring maritime traffic, the castle contains a complex now inhabited by townspeople. Inside are remnants of royal chambers, churches and other structures awaiting archaeological excavation. Also poking above the rooftops is the cylindrical 15th century Venetian Tower, offering panoramic views over terracotta roofs and across the harbor.





CULINARY BOUNTY FROM LAND AND SEA

As a bustling port, Durrës excels in fresh seafood at waterfront spots grilling orodata snapper, mussels sizzling in garlic and olive oil, tangy octopus salads, and more. Equally beloved are the meat-centric specialties like fluffy byrek pies, succulent kebabs, and meze dips with



vegetables. Locals wash it all down with rich red wine or ever-present espresso. Don't leave without sampling scrumptious regional sweet specialties like llokum candy and bakllava oozing with honeyed syrup.

With vestiges of lost civilizations at every turn yet pulsating with contemporary culture, Durrës remains among Albania's most remarkable and resilient cities to encounter today. Visitors depart enchanted by this layers-deep settlement wrapping around a sparkling sea harbor.
