Senate Bill 73 Sextortion Bill Went Into Effect on June 27, 2025

Senate Bill (SB) 73, a comprehensive measure aimed at combating sexual extortion and protecting Kentucky's most vulnerable residents went into effect across the Commonwealth on Friday, June 27.

SB 73 makes sexual extortion a felony offense when the perpetrator possesses compromising material and threatens to use it against a victim. If no material exists but threats are still made, the offense is classified as a misdemeanor. The legislation also provides tougher penalties in cases where the perpetrator has a prior sexual offense conviction, the perpetrator holds a position of authority or trust over the victim, a deadly weapon is used or threatened, and the victim is a minor, suffers serious injury, or attempts suicide as a result of the crime.

Additionally, the bill requires Kentucky schools and colleges to create education and awareness initiatives to help prevent sexual extortion.

SB73 was sponsored by Senator Julie Raque Adams and Sen. Adams was on hand at the Kentucky Statewide Human Trafficking Task Force meeting held in Frankfort on Friday, June 27 to discuss the legislation.

PATH has worked with the Sextortion Coalition since 2023 to see this day come, and joined others at the Task Force meeting to celebrate and plan for implementation. Jaime Thompson, MSSW and PATH Director of Programs (shown below) was a speaker, and joined other members from KYA, UNAKY, and Frankfort Police to discuss sextortion and actions all people can take to stop and respond to this fast growing crime.

PATH had the pleasure to facilitate education and awareness connected to combating human trafficking and to collaborate with other advocates in the anti-trafficking community during June 2025. Jaime Thompson, MSSW and Director of Programs, provided an in-person HT 101 education session in Erlanger, KY on June 5th for The Kenton County Democratic Woman's Club with 15 attendees. Participants lived in Northern Kentucky and a follow-up discussion on potential indicators of labor and sex trafficking of young people yielded increased knowledge of signs and actions to take to report.
