

Royals win series in LA

Greg Maddux (LA) took the hill against Mike Mussina (KC) in a great game 1 matchup, but while Mussina struggled giving up 5 ER in 5.2IP, Maddux cruised through 7 to raise his record to 4-1 in a 5-3 Dodger win. KC couldn't score until a Bobby Bonilla error opened the door, but Mike Fetters closed it. Game 2 was not as smooth for Doc Gooden and the Dodgers bullpen as 3 different pitcher gave up 4 ER in a 15-11 win for the Royals. Steve Avery started for KC and entered the 7th inning with a 12-3 lead, but LA scored 8 runs in the next two innings to make it 12-11, but Tom Candiotti got knocked around and Ricky Bottalico didn't as KC finished it off. Melvin Nieves (KC) went 4 for 6 with 4 rbi and Juan Gonzalez (LA) went 3-5 with 4 rbi in the 26 run game. It came down to Ben McDonald (LA) in game 3, but the Royals scored 11 runs in the first 3 innings and cruised to a 12-4 win. KC was led by "the Royal Family" as their first 4 batters (Eric Young, Ken Caminiti, Albert Belle, Ellis Burks) have come to be known; hitting over .360 collectively.

Twins take two of the vs KC

The Royals Pete Harnisch had some big expectations for 1996, but after giving up 6 ER in 1.2 IP his ERA jumped up to 10.05 in a game 1 13-5 loss. Twin Cecil Fielder delivered the big blows today with 4-rbi helping the Bonds-Eisenreich-McGwire trio that has dominated the early season for Minnesota. In game 2 the Royals beat up Curt Schilling (Min) scoring 5 times in the fourth inning behind Ellis Burks, Tino Martinez and Mike Lieberthal, whose 3-run HR did Schilling in. The Twins came back on a 2-run double from Eisenreich and 2-run single from Todd Zeile so McGwire's HR could win it. In game 3, Mike Mussina chilled the Twin bats with 8 great innings and Ricky Bottalico pitched the ninth for the save for the Royals.

Mariners fight of Dodgers

Ramon Martinez came out in game 1 and absolutely dominated the hometown Mariners with a complete game shutout scattering 7 hits and striking out 12 Mariners. Only 3 hitters on Seattle got hits; Craig Biggio (3-4), Frank Thomas (2-4), and Jim Edmonds (2-4). Unfortunately for the home fans, only in the 6th inning were two of those hits to come in the same inning, but even that had a bad ending as Frank Thomas got thrown out at third by Robert Perez. John Jaha knocked in 3 and Juan Gonzalez plated 2 more in the 7-0 LA win. Game 2 was an epic battle that took 11 innings to settle as the Hometown Mariners squeaked out a win 9-8. LA jumped out with 3 in the first behind Julio Franco and Juan Gonzalez, but Mike Piazza homered in the bottom and it was 3-2 after 1. J.T. Snow tied it with a sac-fly in the second before Piazza, Larry Walker, and Reggie Sanders combined to drive in four more runs in the third for a 7-3 lead. A Franco 3-run homer tied it at 8 in the top of the 9th, but a Larry Walker single won it in the 11th for what felt like more than one win. Seattle took that momentum and opened up 4-0 lead in game 3 in the first two innings and after LA closed in at 5-3 in the 6th inning but Mike Piazza's grand slam made it 9-3 and Darryl Kile pitched all 9 for the series win.

Yankees sweep Braves

Atlanta has struggled out of the gate this season, and the Yankees were not welcoming hosts as they swept the series 10-5, 3-1, and 1-0. In game 1, Ismael Valdes (NY) and Dave Burba (Atl) hooked up in what quickly became an offensive explosion. Chipper Jones (Atl) went 3-5; and he and Alex Rodriguez drove in 5 runs to take a 5-2 lead, but the Yanks came back behind Rusty Greer's 4 for 4 with rbi from 6 different players and a 10-5 win. Brian Boehringer (Atl) made his first start of the season and pitched 8 great innings in game 2, but got little support in a 3-1 loss behind Todd Stottlemyre, Doug Bochtler, and Roberto Hernandez for NY. Tim Belcher (SD) battled Jeff Fassero (Sea) in game 2, but Bernie Williams stayed hot going 2-2 with 2 walks and 2 more rbi to lead San Diego to the win. Tony Clark homered again as Belcher threw 8 and Mark Wohlers saved his 6th. Game 3 was the best game of the series as both David Cone (SD) and Shawn Estes (Sea) got knocked around. Frank Thomas (Sea) knocked in 4 (4-5), but another Tony Clark homer and 3 rbi from Lenny Harris aided Tony Gwynn's 2 rbi in the win.

Twin stay hot vs. Cardinals

Minnesota defended the homer dome winning two of three games against the Cardinals. In game 1, Ken Hill (Min) threw a complete game 5-hit 7K game to outduel Pedro Martinez (StL) who left in the 7th inning with an injury. St. Louis scored in the first behind a Dante Bichette fielder's choice and a homer by Moises Alou in the second, but the Twins came back to get three runs with a Jim Eisenrich double in the third, a Cecil Fielder double in the fifth and a go ahead Todd Zeile single in the sixth to win 3-2. Game 2 was a 13-0 win for Minnesota. Mark McGwire, Mike Macfarlane and Pat Mears each drove in 3 runs in Game 2. Roger Clemens (StL) put a stop to the Twins win streak with a complete game and 10 Ks. Dante Bichette drove in 3 with a homer in the 8-2 Cardinals win, Jason Kendall knocked in two more and every Cardinal got on base during the game. Cecil field drove in the only two runs for the Twins, who were held to just 4 hits. The Big 3 at the top of the Twins lineup (Bonds, Eisenreich, McGwire) kept up their hot starts being on base 5 or 12 times.

Cardinals beat Padres 2 of 3 in their return home under the arch.

St. Louis dominated the first two games of the series. Game 1 saw John Smoltz (StL) dominate the visiting Padres with 8.1 IP for his 4th win. Andy Ashby got beat up giving up 3 in the first and 3 more in a 5-run 4th inning at the hometown Cardinals jumped out to a 8-2 lead. 4-5-6 hitters; Dante Bichette, Luis Rodriguez, and Vinny Castilla combined for 6 hits and 7 RBI in the 10-3 in game 1. After losing the first two games of the series San Diego sent ace Kevin Brown to the mound to battle Cardinals starter Bobby Jones to keep from getting swept. Unfortunately Jones wasn't up for the battle as he gave up 5 ER in 1.2 IP. The Cardinals pen pitched very well, but with Brown giving up only 2 ER (4R) in 8 innings Mark Wohlers (SD) was able to close out the 7-4 win for the Padres.

Dodgers and Cubs renew rivalry in hard fought series

The Los Angeles Dodgers set every regular season record last season, and the Cubs made the world series, so this series was big news across the Wartime fans around the world. Game 1 was an anticlimactic start however as Mark Clark (Chi) got pounded early giving up 6 ER in 1.1 IP. Ben McDonald (LA) threw a complete game shutout for his 3rd win in the 10-0 triumph in which every starting Dodger got at least 1 hit. Game 2 was a bit of a turnabout as Dodger pitcher Ramon Martinez gave up 7 ER in 1IP, and Cub Jamie Navarro tossed a complete game, giving up 1 ER (3 runs) and 7 hits. Greg Maddux and John Burkett hooked up in a battle that was tied at 2 in the top of the seventh. Cliff Floyd walked and went to 3rd on a Jorge Fabregas single. Ozzie Guillen's sacrifice fly scored Floyd, and Maddux and Billy Wagner retired the final 9 outs.

Oakland traveled across the country to battle the last place Braves, but those Braves have started to figure out and the challenge of a solid Oakland squad brought an interesting challenge. Game 1 was a great battle that took 11 innings to settle. Oakland's Steve Trachsel pitched 8 great innings, but Jose Mesa gave up a game tying single to Ricky Otero and off to extra's they went. Alex Fernandez pitched 10 inning with 15 strikeouts. He was pulled in the 11th after giving up 2 singles and Terry Matthews gave up a 3-run homer settling the game in an Oakland 5-3 win. The Braves jumped on A's starter Andy Benes with 3 runs in the first and knocked him out in the 6th in a 10-5 win. Alex Rodriguez hit another 3-run homer in the first and the Braves put together 13 more hits to score 10 runs in the game. Pedro Astacio earned his first win of the season going 6 innings. Game 3 was another 9 inning battle that was back and forth all the way. Both teams score 1 in the first and 3 in the third for a 4-4 tie. In the bottom of the 5th, Paul Molitor homered and Mariano Duncan singled home another for a 6-4 Braves lead. Jeff Bagwell singled home a run in the 6th, and Edgar Renteria singled home the tying run in the 8th. With Dave Mlicki (Oak) pitching, A-Rod double to win it 7-6.

The Yankees got even in game two jumping on Doug Drabek early knocking him out after just 2 innings as they scored 7 off Jerry DiPoto and Drabek in the first 3 innings on their way to a 7-4 win. Eric Anthony landed the big blow in the first with a 3 run homer. Jeff Cirillo had two RBI singles, aiding a great start from Ismael Valdes to get his 4th win. Valdes pitched 8.1 IP and Roberto Hernandez got the final two out for his second save. Game 3 was a high scoring affair as Shane Reynolds and Xavier Hernandez combined to give up 11 ER over 5 IP. Todd Stottlemyre survived 5 innings giving up 6 ER in the 12-8 Yankees win. Reggie Jefferson went 3-5 (3R, 3RBI) and Mark McLemore with 3-4 (4 RBI) powering the Yanks to the win. Melvin Nieves kept up his hot streak for the Royals going 2-3 (2R, 3RBI) and Ellis Burks raised his average to .396 with a 3-5 day (2R, 2RBI).
