Something to Chew On:

New Year, New Start

"Do not be afraid; for see – I am bringing you good news of great joy for all people: to you is born this day in the city of David a Savior, who is the Messiah, the Lord." – Luke 2:10-11

The start of a new year affects everyone differently. Some welcome it as a new beginning full of new opportunities. Some dread it as a reminder that time marches relentlessly forward into the unknown. Some receive it pensively grieving for that which now belongs to times past. The start of a new year has affected me in all these ways before, and I wonder what last year's Christmas climax might mean for us in the coming year.

TV ads, radio stations, and department stores treat Christmas as if it's one day a year, but it's actually a twelve-day season (with a partridge in a pear tree?). New Year's Day always falls on the eighth day of Christmas. Eight is a significant number for Christians. The eighth day is the day of resurrection. It's the day of new creation. It's the day which points to the fulfillment of God's kingdom. In other words, it's a day that symbolizes the realization of salvation in its fullness.

This might sound crazy, especially when our experience of reality crushes us underfoot. However, the good news proclaimed by the Christmas angels assures us that the day of salvation does not just belong to the future. The day of salvation is today. In Greek the angels' message reads like this: "Born to you (all) today is a savior who is Christ the Lord in the city of David." This birth is for you. It is happening today. Salvation is now.

According to Luke, Jesus does not need to become the Savior. He already is the Savior. Salvation does not begin on the cross. It begins in the manger. The birth of the Savior in our midst means something here and now. Salvation is born among us this day, and we find the new year with the Christ child in his cradle. Do not be afraid whoever you are, whatever you suffered in 2019, and however you feel about 2020. Born to you today is a Savior, who is the Messiah, the Lord.
