### Something to Chew On:

#### The Broken Made Whole

From the very first moment I set my foot on campus at Wartburg Theological Seminary I knew something was different. People were friendly and welcoming, living with a genuine love and joy that was contagious. It was a radically different place from the dry, competitive world of college I had just graduated from. It was a community alive with the joy and the love of God! It was a community in which the Gospel was preached and taught with clarity. It was a community where the faith was embodied both in the singing of the assembly at worship and on the streets of the world during J-term trips.

I remember my time at Wartburg fondly, and it's an amazing trick of time that causes the trials I endured to fade from my memory. I don't think about the isolation I felt in my dorm room after breaking my ankle during the first week of class. I don't think about the intense challenges to my faith that jaded me and nearly drove me to embrace atheism. I don't think about the stressful workload and the, at times, annoyingly close proximity in which we lived.

I imagine the disciples must have gone through something similar after Jesus was raised from the dead. The healings, the life-giving teachings, and the miraculous feedings must have been easy to remember while the sheer exhaustion of ministry, the vulnerability of the cross, and the fear on Easter morning must have been easy to forget. Even today, many of Jesus' followers prefer to celebrate Jesus' resurrection on Easter while passing over his death on Good Friday. But salvation is not about remembering the good times and forgetting the bad. It's about all times, both the good and the bad, being held together in Christ.

Jesus takes what is broken and makes it whole again. That is the miracle of Easter. The things we would rather forget about our past, the experiences we would rather sweep under the rug, these are things we need in order to be whole human beings. At times my seminary experience was a little slice of heaven, and at times it thrust me into my own personal hell. Yet looking back on my time at Wartburg I see my own journey from death to new life that has blessed me richly in ministry and, I hope, has blessed the people I serve. May God take your brokenness as God took mine and make you whole through the life of the risen Christ in this Easter season!

He has performed in concert with such folk music stars as John Prine, Joan Baez, and Tom Paxton.
