Reformation Hammer

Bam! Bam! Bam! The hammer of reformation resounds through the hallowed halls of the Wittenberg castle church calling things into question that were simply taken for granted.

Bam! Bam! Bam! The coins in the coffer trembled with each stroke of the hammer, coins that until now had the power to bribe heaven's gatekeeper into allowing anyone whose purse was heavier than their sins to enter Paradise.

Bam! Bam! Bam! A church lost to daydreams of money, power, and prestige startled from her reveries at the sound of her Lord's voice as he knocked at the door desiring to come in.
