Something to Chew On:

The Body of Christ Given For You

I will never forget the first time I assisted with communion. It was an incredible experience. I watched each person as I spoke the words of grace to them, "The body of Christ given for you." Some came forward with heads bowed reverently. Some received the bread with faces as grim as those at a funeral. Some beamed from ear to ear with a smile that radiated inner joy.

I expected my first celebration of communion as a pastor to be filled with the same sense of wonder that it was when I first assisted at the table. But it wasn't. In fact, I felt nothing. Nothing was soon replaced by overwhelming disappointment. Something had changed, and an event that once held so much meaning for me felt, well, ordinary.

We all have experiences in life where the magic is stripped away by the explainable and the mystical is replaced by the everyday. In such moments we discover that our expectations were not grounded in reality. It's the first major conflict between newlyweds, the first criticism at a new job, the first major problem with the home, the first time you wake up and realize that you don't know what to do with the rest of your life. These are moments when reality replaces fiction and faith is disappointed. They are moments when we hear words of grace with our ears or speak them with our mouths while questioning them in our hearts. We are perhaps most vulnerable when reality falls short of our expectations. It is in these moments that we are most likely to question the presence, the power, and the goodness of God.

This kind of disenchantment and questioning would have been part of the first Easter. Jesus died in such a way that few could doubt God was against him. Furthermore, his disciples had no reason to expect him to rise from the dead. They were shocked and afraid when his body turned up missing from the tomb. Even in the midst of that trauma, the risen Christ appeared. New life and new understanding sprang from the dashed hopes and dreams of the cross. This is the promise of, "The body of Christ given for you." This is the promise of the resurrection.

Communion is for the disappointed and the disenchanted. It is for the confused and the afraid. It is for all who hunger for new life. In short, it is for you and for me. Whether we receive this meal in reverence, sorrow, or joy we can be confident that it bears the seed of new life for us. We are not confident because of how we feel or what we believe as we receive the gifts. We are confident, because the Crucified is risen. In the words of the well-known Lenten hymn, "Seed that in earth is dying grows into ears of grain. Grapes that are crushed in the vessel turn into golden wine. God, through this mystery grant us faith in our deepest darkness, life in our night and death."
