Something to Chew On:

The Apostles' Creed – Third Article

I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting. Amen.

This article might be one of the most difficult and most significant declarations of our time. Right now, there is a lot of anger directed against the church. Not all of it is undeserved. The coverup of abuse within the Catholic church has been alarming and appalling. The use of scripture by other churches to justify injustice is equally disturbing. Then, there are the churches that seem checked out of this life as they wait for the next one. One angry teacher took to Facebook ranting, "Remind me why the church is good?" Another angry mother posted on Facebook, "I wonder whether I should spend an hour at mass praying for victims of gun violence or spend an hour at home thinking about ways to stop gun violence." How can we say we trust in the holy catholic church, the communion of saints, and the forgiveness of sins when there is so much anger and hurt?

As I've wrestled with this article of faith I've been forced to wrestle with these questions. Maybe there's no good answer. Then again, maybe it would help to reframe the struggle. I've found the most helpful way of approaching this article is to remember that this article is first and foremost about the work of the Holy Spirit, God's own personal Spirit. God's Spirit gathers the church to forgive sins and distribute the gifts of eternal life. The church is not an institution even though it is organized as an institution. The church is the body of Christ in the world, broken by sin, and living in the hope of the resurrection. Being church doesn't change our status as sinners. Being church means that the life-giving Spirit which raised Jesus from the dead is breathing out life among us.

God's Spirit is the object of our trust. We proclaim Jesus to whom the Spirit bears witness; we do not proclaim ourselves. God's Spirit must work through the flesh and blood of this world. If we deny this, we deny that God wears our flesh in Jesus Christ. We deny the practical, concrete implications of our faith. In short, we deny the reality of salvation. Let us remember our calling to struggle against sin daily. Let us remember that the Spirit of Life is always reforming the church. Let us remember and give thanks to God who is our light and our salvation.
