# Something to Chew On:

# The Apostles' Creed - First Article

I believe in God, the Father almighty, creator of heaven and earth.

In a time of fake news and alternative facts the words, "I believe," often sound like a stubborn doctrinal spin. Belief becomes a matter of persuasion, an all-to-often divisive opinion about things no one can prove. To the pragmatic listener, the words "I believe in God" sound as silly as the words "I believe in unicorns". To the rest of us, they sound suspiciously like a test for orthodoxy.

The word "creed" comes from the Latin word "credo" which means "I believe". Credo is the Latin translation of the Greek word  $\pi$ ιστεύω (pisteuo) which means "to put trust in" someone or something who is worthy of trust. Believing in God is not about being persuaded of God's existence or fitting God into a tidy doctrinal box. To believe in God means nothing less than to completely trust God and to consider God worthy of sacred trust.

Who and what we trust in life matters. For example, I may trust money for security. I may trust my own strength for safety. I may trust diet and exercise to give me a long, full life. I may trust hard work to bring me success. Sooner or later we find out that many of the things we put our trust in were not worthy of our trust. They are perishable like us, existing in a fallen state that is subject to instincts of self-interest and self-preservation. Only God is worthy of our trust. But what kind of God do we have?

The ancients knew God as the Father almighty, the origin and caretaker of all that is. God does not simply set the world in motion like a machine then go to sleep. God is and continues to be intimately involved in the care of all creation. Through the first article of the Apostles' Creed we cling in love to God like a child hanging on a parent. This trust is our anchor no matter what we face. When we are without, when we are sick and suffering, when we are confronted with the limits of our own existence this one little declaration of trust reminds us that our lives are in God's loving hands. This gives us courage to face whatever challenges come our way. God is God in all things, and God gives good gifts to you as loving parents give good gifts to their children.
