Community-Based Assessments (CBA) help us see what kind of work you're good at and what support you might need.

Job Prep & Seeking

JCI helps you figure out what you like to do, what you're good at, and what kind of help you need. We work with local companies to find or create a job that's right for you. We can help you:

- search for jobs,
- write a resume,
- fill out applications, and
- practice for interviews.



Job Training

JCI provides a Job Support Specialist to work alongside you at your job, so you can learn how to do it well, until you feel confident.



Job Support

As you get better at your job, JCI will step back and let you do more on your own. But we will still check in regularly to make sure everything is going well.



What does JCI do?

JCI helps people who are referred by the Division of Employment and Independence for People with Disabilities (EIPD) (formerly VR - Vocational Rehabilitation) find and keep a job. Does it cost anything?

No, JCI services are paid for by EIPD (VR), so they are free for you.

What does JCI offer beyond EIPD (VR) services?

JCI gives extra help beyond just finding a job. Once you get a job offer, JCI helps you with things like:

- Making a daily checklist,
- Learning how to talk to your boss and co-workers,
- And getting used to your new job.

We want to make sure you feel comfortable and have a plan to succeed!

Will I lose my benefits (Medicaid / SSI / SSDI) if I start working?

If you're worried about losing benefits like healthcare when you work, EIPD (VR) can help. There are rules to make sure you can still get the help you need while starting your career.

STEPS



Contact your local county EIPD (VR) office (below) to see if you qualify for services.



Work with EIPD (VR) to check if you qualify, make an overall plan, and get referred to JCI.



JCI will reach out to you once they get the referral.



Meet with a JCI Employment Specialist to make an individualized plan just for you.



Start working on your plan towards employment!
