' Movimento, Figuras, Memorias'

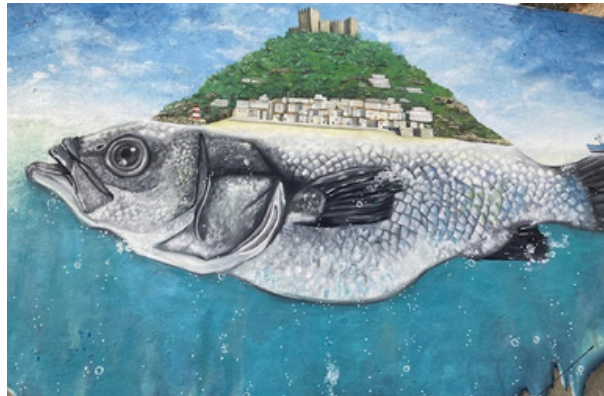
An exhibition that will show works that draw on modern and reflective themes of movement, landscape nature and memory.

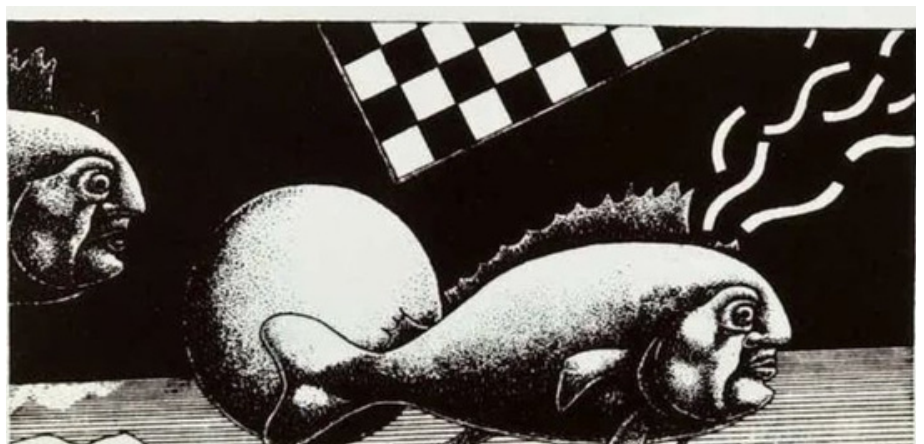

O Peixe, o Surrealism e a Arte Portuguesa

Portuguese surrealism explores the unconscious and our imagination through dreamlike imagery, symbolism, and a sense of the uncanny and humour in the farcical predicaments of humankind. You can see some of this imagery in the graffiti and wall art freely displayed around Portuguese cities and towns, sometimes using images from the animal world combined with figures and symbols. More recently, 20th century surrealist art became a way of lambasting the political regime and its leaders and followers.

The movement included artists such as Cruzeiro Seixas, Mário Cesariny, and João Artur da Silva, as well as **Ludgero Viegas Pinto aka LUD** (1948 – 2001) a renowned illustrator, printmaker and artist who also illustrated books by some prominent Portuguese authors.

Julio Pomar (1926-2018) a Portuguese artist known for his lithographs and prints, was also a prominent figure in the Portuguese neo-realist movement, characterised by a figuration that connects the association of images developed by surrealism and the abstract expressionism seen in this piece.

His work came out of his intense activity and a continuous desire for thematic diversification. He often referenced animals and mythological figures with combinations of tigers and rain hats, monkeys, and heads. His works are displayed internationally as well as being housed in a stunning new museum in Lisbon.

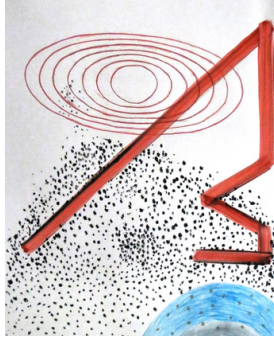

Fernando uses mixed media to build works with layers of meaning often abstracted from other images. his work has a preoccupation with spiritual and hermetical order.
