

HISTORY 1915 - 1965

In February of 1915 a group of young ladies of the Immanuel congregation decided to use their skill with the sewing needle to help support the work of their church. They met at the Jens Blixrud home and organized the "Willing Workers' Sewing Circle" which was to meet each month with members sewing, embroiding, crocheting and knitting articles to be auctioned off at a bazaar held in the fall of each year. The proceeds were to be used in maintaining the church building and for the purchase of new furnishings as needed.

The bazaars were held as planned, often in connection with a chicken supper. At first the Barrett Hall was used for these events, later the church basement. Many food sales have also been held in connection with the sale of aprons and other hand-made articles. Lovely quilt tops were pieced and quilted; some were sold while

others were given away.

Over the years the Sewing Circle purchased new hymnaries, the colored hangings for the altar and pulpit, the flags displayed in our church, and the rug in the chancel. Part of the indebtedness incurred by the building of the church basement was paid by the Sewing Circle; also in purchasing the organ, stained glass windows and church pews, aisle carpet, repairing and redecorating the church at various times.

A special project of the Sewing Circle has been the upkeep of the cemetery. The organization has taken upon itself to keep the cemetery neatly maintained, trees planted and a fence erected.

In the 1950's the Willing Workers' Sewing Circle became interested in Missions. In the event of the death of a member or in the members' family a memorial has been sent to the

Mission work of the Church. A new phase of mission needs has been taken up by the Willing Workers', that of using their skills to help the destitute of the world. Quilt tops were sewed for the refugees in Hong Kong, layettes for babies in Japan and clothing for boys and girls in Palestine. Every year boxes of clothing have been sent to abandoned and orphaned African children at Meiganga, Cameroun, Africa. A former Sewing Circle member, Lillian Shervey Michelson, is a Missionary on this field. We have also made quilts, layettes, Nurses' aprons and other articles for this same field. Countless rolls of bandages have been made out of old sheets for use in hospitals and dispensaries. Another daughter of Immanuel congregation, Miss Corinne Johnson, is a Missionary nurse in the same area. We are especially happy to help her fill a barrel with bandages to bring back for use on the field when Corinne returns.

In His wonderful way God has given the Willing Workers' Sewing Circle many opportunities for service. We are grate of for

each one of them.

As we begin our fifty-first year we pray that He will be with us and guide us in all that we undertake that His will may be done.
