What a difference several warm sunny days and a good soaking rain will do to ignite Spring into bloom! Nature has many details that we sometimes miss, so look a little closer and absorb all the magic and beauty she displays.

The following excerpt from *The Comfort of Crows* by Margaret Renkl focuses on one.

Praise Song for Solomon's Seal

The purple-tinged stalks pop up out of the ground with their foliage tightly furled, but very soon the leaves will open up like a teenager who has learned she's beautiful, like the lonely person loved. The striped leaves are all you notice at first, the perfect embodiment of springtime: cool and green and growing. Then in a day or two, the white flowers appear, dainty and delicate, miniature bells nodding toward the damp soil on purple stems, nearly hidden under the showy leaves.

Bend down. Lean closer. The flowers will stir in the wake of your smallest breath. These bells are ringing for anyone who listens to the rustle of wind in the leaves, to the hush of sweat bees moving from flower to flower in the cool spring air.

"Set me a seal upon your heart as a seal upon your arm," the poet says in the Song of Solomon, "for love is strong as death." Here is this profusion of flowers as proof.

Take some time to explore your garden more closely this Springtime, maybe you'll find some surprise and delights.

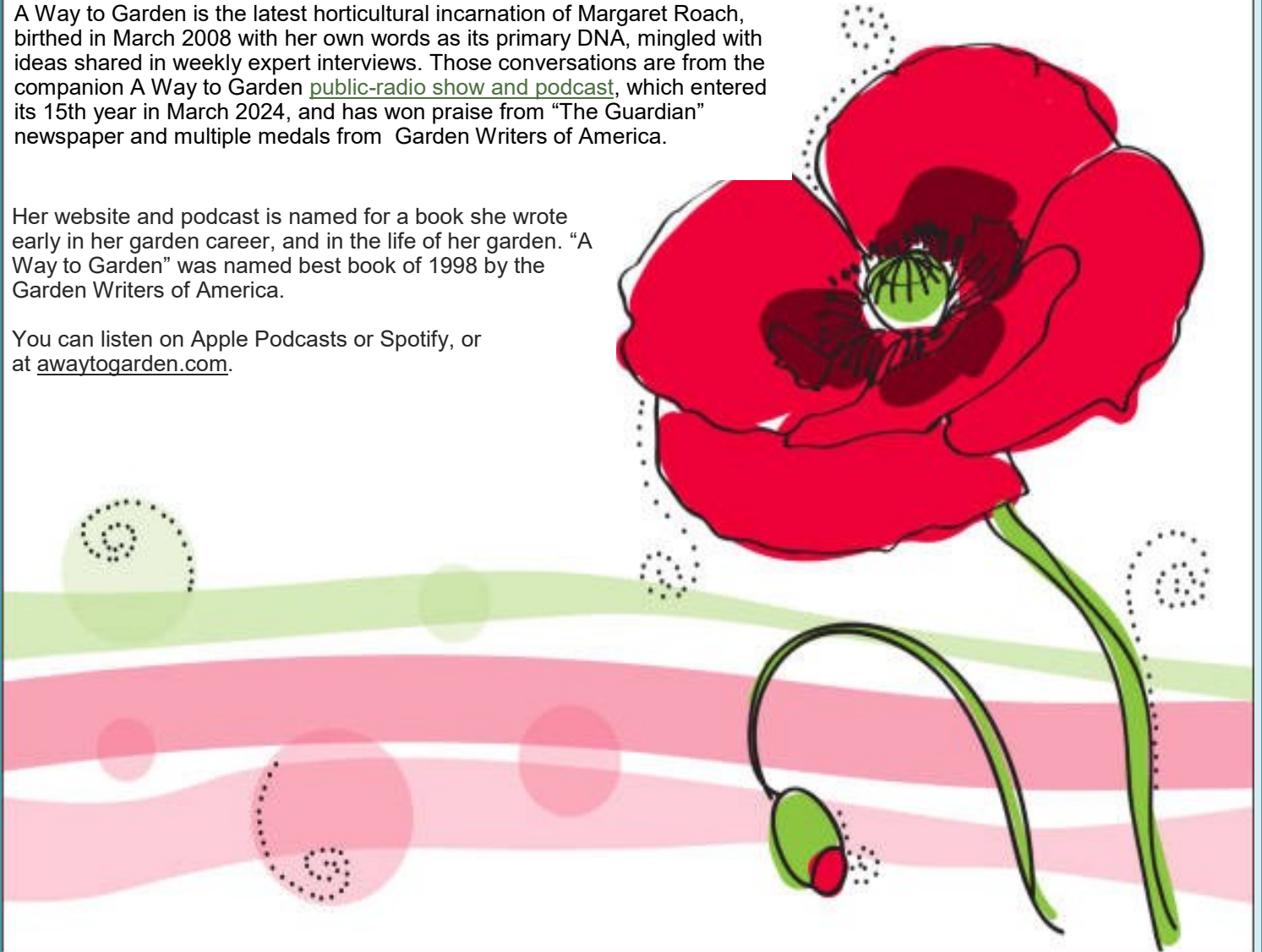
POPPY'S PODCASTS

A Way to Garden is the latest horticultural incarnation of Margaret Roach, birthed in March 2008 with her own words as its primary DNA, mingled with ideas shared in weekly expert interviews. Those conversations are from the companion A Way to Garden [public-radio show and podcast](#), which entered its 15th year in March 2024, and has won praise from "The Guardian" newspaper and multiple medals from Garden Writers of America.

Her website and podcast is named for a book she wrote early in her garden career, and in the life of her garden. "A Way to Garden" was named best book of 1998 by the Garden Writers of America.

About the Host

Margaret Roach has been writing about gardening for more than 30 years. She was garden editor at "Newsday" newspaper (one of the country's largest dailies) and then for Martha Stewart, where she was the first garden editor of "Living" magazine and later EVP/Editorial Director of her magazines, books and internet.

She walked away from a career and "success" to explore personal creativity again. The book she wrote about dropping out, "[And I Shall Have Some Peace There](#)," was published in February 2011; her next, a garden memoir and handbook called "[The Backyard Parables](#)," in January 2013.

Since April 2020, she has also written the "In the Garden" column for The New York Times.
