After a trailblazing public relations career that included creating and building the leading marketing-PR firm DeVries Global, and then a career as a ballroom dance competitor and teacher, Madeline de Vries Hooper immersed herself in the world of gardening. She was invited to become a trustee of the Brooklyn Botanic Garden and then of the Berkshire Botanical Garden, where she has been Vice Chair for the past 10 years. She has visited many of the finest gardens in the United States and Europe and developed relationships with leading horticulturalists, garden designers, and plantspeople.

However, her passion for gardening left her with many aches and pains. A friend recommended she work with a personal trainer and she learned new techniques and exercises to relieve her pain and enable her to garden more enjoyably and productively. These newfound habits were the inspiration for the GardenFit television show and workshop program. Madeline and her husband live in Columbia County, New York, where for the past 20 years they have devoted themselves to maintaining Rockland Farm, a 10-acre garden they created from scratch.

About Adam Schersten

Adam started his career working for a coastal engineering firm in Florida as a boat captain and went on to teach SCUBA diving. It was through both these experiences that he realized the importance of maintaining one's fitness in order to enjoy nature for as long as possible. After being encouraged by a personal training friend to turn his passion for fitness into a real profession, Adam moved to New York City. His 11 years of experience as a personal trainer began with Equinox before becoming an independent trainer working with a wide range of NYC professionals and celebrities. He then went on to form his own corporate wellness and training company, First Move Wellness, which conducts workshops that address the pain and posture of an increasingly computer-bound workforce. He wrote The Esquire Guide to Bodyweight Training which embraces the concepts of calisthenics to help people improve their fitness with minimal or no equipment.

As a Vermont native and water-sport enthusiast, moving to NYC required finding new ways to enjoy nature. Adam coped by walking around his neighborhoods with a tree identification book and learning about all of the city's trees. He ultimately joined the Bonsai club at the Brooklyn Botanical Garden and for the past ten years has nurtured trees on a rooftop garden while also maintaining a jungle of houseplants.

Jeff, who served as the GardenFit Season 1 trainer, is an award-winning fitness trainer with more than three decades of experience. He holds a Bachelor of Science in Physical Education and began working as a fitness trainer at the Turnberry Spa in Miami, renowned for its celebrity clientele. He went on to own and operate fitness businesses in Los Angeles and New York City, and has maintained a private training business since 1988. Jeff has created programs for a wide variety of clients: from high-school athletes to Hollywood celebrities, CEOs and corporate professionals, to skiers, golfers, farmers, moms and dads.

In 2004, Jeff moved to Columbia County, New York, where he opened his TrainerFit Studio. This is where he coined the phrase "train the mind, the body will follow," which incorporates a cognitive slant to conventional fitness training practices. Jeff's training philosophy is that bodies accept new habits because they make sense and his training sessions are therefore filled with logical balance and strength techniques taught as habits. He trains one-on-one and creates programs that fit each client's physical and lifestyle needs. Jeff competed in the 2015 OCB Big East Natural Physique Championships in New York and won 1st place in the master's category as well as 3rd, 4th and 5th in other categories. He has coached both high school football and track & field and taught college-level physical education.
