# MCMGA BOARD MEETING MINUTES

December 2, 2025

**Attendees:** Pam Horner, Darlene Davies-Warner, Jean Persely, Pam Voss, David Lowenstein, and Lisa Lane.

Jean called the meeting to order at 6:30 pm.

**Approval of Last Meeting Minutes** – Motion to approve by Lisa, and seconded by Darlene, motion carried.

Next meeting – Jan 6, 2026 at 6:30 p.m.

**MSUE report** – Maggie Marowski has started as the new EMG coordinator. She is getting trained in the volunteer system, will be the EMG coordinator starting in January. The annual banquet will include a free dessert menu. Anyone due for recognition are being worked through now. Program at the Ford House on April 17<sup>th</sup> – will be a cost associated with it.

**Treasurer's Report:** November treasurer report was reviewed by the board. In January the website is up for renewal and the tax IRS form is due. The Square should be up and running for the January meeting. A motion was made to approve the November treasurer report, was seconded, and the motion carried.

**Education Chair Report:** January is a quarterly meeting, Lisa will represent Jean at the meeting.

**Grant Chair Report:** Changes are being made to the grant application package per last month's discussion.

Incidental purchases up-to \$100 for immediate need can be done then presented at next BOD mtg; Guest fee updates- Members are free – guest is free. If a presenter is a high price, charge members a fee, plus additional fee for guests. Non-members – suggest donation of a certain amount. A sign will be posted at the registration desk.

## MCMGA SEED LIBRARY

The MCMGA maintains a seed library for members, free of charge. The seed library is prepared by MCMGA members after collecting seed heads at the end of the season. Saving seeds properly assures purity in the next generation. A seed is a promise of future life. Learning how to avoid cross pollination, timing flower development, collecting the best of a species seeds assures healthy future plants. Many nature lovers want to preserve and protect plants. Our goal is to provide healthy seed to our members.

Proper storage, labeling and testing are done before the seeds are put into the library. First the seeds are stored in refrigeration for a minimum of six weeks to give them a dormancy period, which is required for germination. After the dormancy period is complete, the seeds are tested for viability via several methods to determine the percent that will sprout. The testing usually involves placing seeds in the dark in damp paper towels, some seeds can also be tested in water. Seeds that are viable are packaged up and labeled and added to our seed library.

Volunteers are working on the seed library now and the seed library will be available to the members at the regular monthly meetings in the late winter and early spring. An assortment of seeds will be available, both native and non-native flowers and vegetable plants.
