Dave Putt called the meeting to order at 11:01am.

The 12/16/2021 board meeting minutes were approved.

Professional comments

David Lowenstein reported that MG recertification is open and working. David will set up a meeting for banquet volunteers. He's also looking for a speaker on native plants. Dave Putt has a couple suggestions and will share with David. David informed the board of several future events:

- Garden tour on grasses & sedges 7/12 & 7/13 at MSU Extension Office
- Lavender Fest 7/15-17 at Blake's

January 18 Meeting

There are 29 members registered to date. The board prefers to keep the meeting in-person due to membership renewals and workshop presentation. Masks and covid screening are required. The link for the screening will be emailed to members prior to the meeting. Pam Voss will attend and bring a sign-in sheet. Board members will arrive at 6pm to assist with renewal process. Sara will bring 2 hard copies of the membership roster and her laptop. The board would like to share the roster with members but consent is needed. Those members attending the 1/18 meeting will be asked for consent; others members can be polled by email or called. Each board member will speak about their responsibilities. Sara and Ellen will handle updates to the membership roster.

Treasurer report

The bank balance is \$4951.99. There will be a credit of \$6.44 for Nance checks and tbd credit from Kroger; there will be a debit for P.O. Box renewal. Since the Huntington walk-in was closed in late December, Sara, Dave & Dennis will meet there on Friday 1/14 at 1pm to revise the signature authorizations on the account. They will also inquire about a credit card for the club's account.

Membership renewals

The 2022 renewal form was emailed to members, approx. 70 members currently. There is some concern that Emeritus status (\$10 renewal) does not include membership to MMGA. Dave Putt will ask David to put a notice in the MSUE newsletter to draw in new members.

Grants for 2022

Dave will bring hard copies of the grant application to the 1/18 meeting. Dave's looking for an electronic copy of the grant guidelines. If anyone has the file, please send to Dave.

Website update

Sara found a payment to Weebly in 2020 but none in 2021. It appears that when MCMGA responsibility for the website changed, Weebly had no one to charge so our website and domain were dropped. Dave stated that Macombcountymga.org is available for \$9.99/yr; the board agrees to pursue a multi-year agreement. Dave explained website options: restore with Weebly/Square or develop new with Go Daddy. The board approved a motion for Dave to build a new website and \$300 to start work with Go Daddy. Dave will survey the members for features desired in our website. Incorporating PayPal would be desirable.

Email account

Dave believes that the yahoo email account was tied to the website and it disappeared along with the website. He will pursue a new email along with website development.

Program

Meetings will be scheduled on 2nd, 3rd or 4th Tuesday. Dennis offered some topics for future meetings: water gardening, hydroponics, orchids and pruning. Dennis stated that speakers are slow to respond to his requests to present. The board approved a motion to allow Dennis to book a speaker if fee is \$150 or less.

New Book on the Shelf By Dave Putt

A World Without Soil: The Past, Present, and Precarious Future of the Earth Beneath Our Feet

by Jo Handelsman and Kayla Cohen / Nov 23, 2021 / Yale University Press/ 262 pp.



Jo Handelsman is a Professor in the Department of Plant Pathology at the University of Wisconsin at Madison and a former science advisor to President Barack Obama. In this new release she explores the enigma of how we depend on soil for 95% our global food production and yet we treat our earth's life-sustaining ribbon of soil as something disposable. Many of the best practices for maintaining soil health have been known for decades, yet we continue to use outdated and destructive methods in agriculture and at home. She makes us aware that one of the simplest and least expensive remedies for combating global climate change is to treat our soil better. Soil organic matter sequesters more carbon than the total amount of carbon released by human activities since the start of the Industrial Revolution. I found Chapter 7, "The Climate-Soil Duet" to be the most eloquent discourse on this subject that I have ever read. The author remains optimistic and encourages all of us to become better stewards of the soil.
