

Dave Putt called the meeting to order at 4pm. The 2/10/2022 board meeting minutes were approved.

Professional Comments

The Macomb County MG banquet is scheduled for 5/4/2022 and the registration is live online.

The Lavender Festival is the weekend of 7/15/2022 at Blake's. There was discussion about how much support MCMGA can offer. Ellen Collins suggested having a paper flyer promoting membership in MCMGA. Sara Grix suggested using a QR code to accomplish the same result. The benefits of the organization should be highlighted. Ellen will follow up.

Treasurer Report

Sara Grix presented the report. Financials are healthy.

Membership Renewals

Sara Grix reported 63 applications with payment have been received; 13 members failed to renew. 52 renewals were received in-person or by mail; 11 were renewed online. The paperwork for MMGA was submitted and receipt confirmed.

Dave Putt stated that Pam Voss sent him the names of all the certified MGs in Macomb County. There are about 200, so there's an opportunity to significantly increase our membership. Karen suggested holding a membership drive at the MG banquet. Ways to promote the organization were discussed: providing 11 educational hours, discounted/prorated membership dues, or project leader awarded money for getting qualified MG volunteers to join.

Grants for 2022

Three applications have been received and a fourth is in process. Karen Burke reported that Joann Roman and Anne Crotser want to be on the grant committee. Sara mentioned that several other members indicated an interest in being on the committee. Sara will send the names to Karen.

Program

Speakers for March through May are scheduled. March meeting will be Zoom, April is in-person, guest donation \$5. Dave Putt stated that the organization has the funds to schedule a bigger name speaker once a year. This would help promote the club with increased attendance. Speakers for June through November are TBD.

Other Expenditures

Dave Putt was able to locate a higher resolution MCMGA logo for the table skirt. Cost is \$125. Dave will place the order.

The board approved the purchase of a return address stamp for MCMGA business. Sara Grix will handle selection and order.
