

















Complete AVM occlusion





Diagnosed with ruptured right parietal AVM.




DSA shows small right parietal AVM






Microcatheter angiogram in AP and lateral projection

Onyx cast, Complete AVM occlusion




60/F Dural AVF

- Presented with generalized and progressive slowing of mental process and loss of memory, difficulty in word finding (dementia).
- CT: shows cerebral venous congestion, edema and prominent veins s/o Dural AVF.



DSA shows dural AVF involving superior compartment of right transverse sinus supplied my multiple arteries.
