

## Case 1: Blood in vomit

- 35/M with pancreatitis presented with sudden onset massive bleeding in vomit.
- CT angiography shows large bulge(pseudoaneurysm) in the artery adjacent to the pancreas suggesting the site of bleeding.



Gastro-duodenal artery Psuedoaneurysm



Large bulge in the artery (pseudoaneurysm) representing the site of bleeding

The artery supplying pseudoaneurysm is occluded with multiple wires called coils thereby completely stopping the bleed



## Case 2: Bleeding in stool

Severe bleeding into the large bowel (arrow)

Treated with selective Blockage of the bleeding artery

Emergency surgery avoided



Coils
