As we continue to shape our ministry together, your Session has expressed great interest in renewing our support for Habitat for Humanity in Gaston County. They voted to participate in a current fundraising drive that has invited local churches to designate a Sunday on which church members make a \$10 donation as part of a worship service. We will do this on July 17. (One can certainly give less or more!)

Dixon Village is the name of the current project. It is a unique approach in which 1/3 of the homes in this development, located in N. Belmont, will be provided as Habitat homes, mixed in with 2/3 of the development which will be sold at market value. The intent is to provide a stable neighborhood in which to support home ownership for those unable to purchase a home otherwise. Those who wish will be able to give during worship via text, check, cash or online using the code HGFAITH to designate your gift for this particular project.

Approved a request from Habitat for Humanity to ask congregation members to contribute \$10.00 each, on a designated Sunday, to help build Habitat homes in Dixon Village, a new residential area in North Belmont.

Received an update from Nan Kaylor about the plans and schedule for VBS.

Ransom Hunter Remembrance Day Celebration July 3, 1:00

Our church has received an invitation to this event to be held at the Burge Memorial Church Cemetery on the corner of S. Hawthorne St. and Catawba Ave.

Ransom Hunter, born into slavery, is believed to be the first freed slave to own property in Gaston County. He owned land that today is downtown Mount Holly.

Among many accomplishments, Hunter developed a community he named "Freedom" as a refuge for fellow former slaves. He donated land for a school, and for what is now Burge Memorial United Methodist Church as well as land that would become the first cemetery for negro people in Gaston County.

In 2017 the Mount Holly Historical Society named Ransom Hunter their Historic Person of the Year.
