

At the age of 21, Cooper Elle Rodenburg is one of the youngest CEOs in American history.

Legislative Report



GOVERNOR'S 5 POINT PROPERTY TAX RELIEF PLAN:

Require Common Sense Local Spending Limits

Require Two-Thirds Voter Approval for Tax Increases

Empower Voters to Roll Back Taxes

Create Appraisal Predictability and Cap Appraisal Growth

Eliminate School Property Taxes for Homeowners

For the first item (Require Common Sense Local Spending Limits) the Governor wants to do this by limiting spending to population plus inflation or 3.5% whichever is less.

For the second item (Require Two-Thirds Voter Approval for Tax Increases) the Governor wants to require all property tax increases to be voted on by the citizens. Also, the vote must win a two-thirds majority before the tax increase can take effect.

For item three (Empower Voters to Roll Back Taxes) if 15% of registered voters in a local area sign a petition, they can force a roll back election to lower tax rates.

For item four (Create Appraisal Predictability and Cap Appraisal Growth) the Governor wants appraisals done every five years instead of every year. He also wants the homestead appraisal cap to go from 10% to 3%, and to expand it to all properties, not just homesteads.

For item five (Eliminate School Property Taxes for Homeowners) will require a constitutional amendment.

THE POWER OF STATE SOVEREIGN IMMUNITY OVER THE FEDERAL GOVERNMENT

JANUARY 1, 2026

James Iredell, William Paca, and other ratifiers of the Constitution were clear that the federal judiciary was not supreme over the states. It took Joseph Story and John Marshall to begin the long slide into centralized power that exists today—an outcome founders like Iredell and Paca explicitly warned against.

On this day in 1751, James Iredell was born. A brilliant figure of the founding era, he was a writer and young legal prodigy who played an integral role in North Carolina's transition from colonialism to republicanism.

Just before the American War for Independence, Iredell penned the pamphlet *To the Inhabitants of Great Britain*, which articulated his constitutional arguments against the British concept of parliamentary sovereignty. That principle—incorporated into Britain's unwritten constitution following the Glorious Revolution—held that parliamentary policies superseded any sectional power balances held by Britain's colonies and its king.

In support of the finalized United States Constitution, Iredell's most significant contribution to North Carolina's ratification campaign was his insistence that state governments would retain their existing judicial authority under the new constitutional framework. He described the Constitution as an instrument designed to prevent the federal government from encroaching upon matters outside its defined jurisdiction: "When Congress passes a law consistent with the Constitution, it is to be binding on the people. If Congress, under pretense of executing one power, should, in fact, usurp another, they will violate the Constitution."

Unlike some of his more famous and ambitious Federalist peers, Iredell's greatest distinction was his consistency. He remained firmly committed to the constitutional principles he articulated during the ratification debates. Reflecting this commitment, he was appointed as one of George Washington's original six Supreme Court justices and served on the Court until his death in 1799.

Iredell's most consequential post-ratification stance emerged in his dissent in the 1793 case *Chisholm v. Georgia*, an early attempt to expand the authority of the federal judiciary over the states. His reasoning helped spur Congress and the states to draft and ratify the [Eleventh Amendment](#), which overturned the Court's opinion and reaffirmed the doctrine of state sovereign immunity against federal overreach.
