

Supreme Leader of Iran Khamenei dead following Israel's strike on Iran - Fox News Last Update March 1, 2026, 4:27 AM EST

A massive U.S.-Israeli joint military offensive called "Operation Epic Fury" is underway in Iran, targeting Islamic Republic regime leadership and military targets that pose an "imminent threat."

WHAT TO KNOW

- A U.S. senior official confirms to Fox News that Iran's Supreme Leader Ayatollah Ali Khamenei, along with 5-10 top leaders, was killed after an Israeli strike in Tehran as part of a massive coordinated U.S.-Israeli military offensive called "Operation Epic Fury."
- President [Donald Trump](#) confirmed Saturday that the U.S. is carrying out "major combat operations in Iran." In a video posted to Truth Social, Trump said the objective is to defend Americans by eliminating imminent threats from the Iranian regime, describing it as "a vicious group of very hard, terrible people."
- In his message, Trump urged the [Iranian](#) regime to "lay down" its weapons or "face certain death." Calling it their "only chance for generations," Trump urged the people of Iran to "take over your government" after the operation.
- The joint [military operation](#) is expected to carry on for days. Officials tell Fox News that Israel is targeting Iranian leadership, while the U.S. is targeting military targets and ballistic missile sites that pose an "imminent threat."

Israel striking Iranian terror regime targets in 'heart of Tehran'

The Israel Defense Forces said Sunday morning it has launched strikes in the "heart of Tehran," hitting targets that belong to the Iranian terror regime.

The IDF said these strikes in the Iranian capital are the first ones under "Operation Roaring Lion," which is the name [Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu](#) gave to the joint U.S.-Israel attack on Iran.

The wave of strikes are being conducted by the Israeli Air Force with guidance from IDF intelligence. Large-scale strikes conducted on Saturday made it possible for the Israelis to "establish superiority and to pave the path to Tehran," the IDF said.



Trump warns Iran against following through with retaliation threats

President [Donald Trump](#) warned Iran early Sunday that the U.S. will strike them with a force never seen before if Tehran follows through with its retaliation threats.

“Iran just stated that they are going to hit very hard today, harder than they have ever been hit before,” Trump wrote on Truth Social. “THEY BETTER NOT DO THAT, HOWEVER, BECAUSE IF THEY DO, WE WILL HIT THEM WITH A FORCE THAT HAS NEVER BEEN SEEN BEFORE!”

Trump's warning came after the Islamic Revolutionary Guard Corps (IRGC) said earlier Sunday that it would launch its “most-intense offensive operation,” beginning in “moments.”

Iran's Supreme Leader Ayatollah Ali Khamenei was killed Saturday in a targeted Israeli military strike.

Israeli defense minister says ‘justice has been served’ after supreme leader killed

Israeli Defense Minister [Israel Katz](#) said “justice has been served” after Iran's Supreme Leader Ayatollah Ali Khamenei was killed in an Israeli strike Saturday.

“The oppressor Khamenei was thwarted in the opening strike of Operation ‘Lion’s Roar,’ along with other senior officials in the Iranian terror fortress,” Katz said in a statement Sunday. “Whoever acted to destroy Israel was destroyed.”

“Justice has been served, and the axis of evil has suffered a fatal blow,” he added.

Katz praised Israeli Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu for his “leadership and determination” and the Israel Defense Forces for its “brilliant execution.”

When Competition Turns Negative

As primary season draws to a close, we've all seen the shift that always seem to take place. What begins as healthy competition over ideas can unfortunately devolve into negative campaigns, personal attacks, and even harassment at the polls. This should concern all of us as a party. No voter or volunteer should ever feel intimidated, pressured, or harassed for supporting the candidate they believe best represents their values, regardless of whether its an incumbent or a challenger. Primaries are about choice, not coercion and mud slinging.

The Wounds We Create

Negative tactics don't just impact candidates. They impact relationships within our party. Words spoken in the heat of a campaign, accusations that may or may not be grounded in fact, and confrontations at polling locations can create real and lasting divisions among neighbors, volunteers, and fellow Republicans. These wounds don't automatically disappear on Election Day. If left unaddressed, they can follow us into November and weaken our ability to present a unified front. These are the same steps that lead to us losing HD-70, and we have yet to gain it back.

At the same time, it is important to recognize what it takes for someone to step forward and put their name on a ballot. Regardless of who you supported, every candidate deserves appreciation for being willing to serve their community in such a public way. The same goes for the volunteers who block walk, make calls, host events, and give their time to causes they believe in. Often overlooked are the spouses and children of candidates, who feel the strain of long nights, missed time at home, and the emotional weight that campaigns bring. Running for office is never an individual effort. It is a family commitment.

March 3 Is Almost Here

March 3 is upon us, and with it comes the end of this part of the process. Hallelujah! Once the ballots are counted, our focus must immediately shift from competition to cooperation. The primary exists to allow voters to select their preferred Republican candidate. The general election exists to determine which party will lead. We must not lose sight of that ultimate goal in November.
