The Divine Providence President?

We celebrate President's Day every February--children are out of school, government entities are closed, and the stores tout their clearance sales. But why? The answer may seem obvious but it caused me to reflect and to dig deeper in regards to those who we honor at this time each year.

As I contemplated the holiday, I wondered specifically about our first president and what made him so revered and celebrated. As I researched beyond the well-known facts, I found some incredibly interesting information about George Washington. They certainly don't teach us these things in school! (Unfortunately!)

As I began to research Washington, it quickly became clear that he possessed many admirable qualities, as found in his decision-making and how he handled situations throughout his life. He has been described as an imposing figure, which certainly would have aided him in ordering his men with authority. He was also said to have strength beyond that of his peers and an unrelenting determination. Another quality that stood out to me, and was a common thread throughout his life, was his precision and attention to detail. He was quite deliberate in his planning, designing, and executing of all things, including architectural plans, his personal dress and habits, and his military strategy.

Washington was said to be quite humble but with a confident demeanor. As our first President, he must have been aware that he was setting traditions and precedents for our country, as well as being upheld as an example of morality. This must have inspired the public, as it certainly did his troops, who followed him repeatedly into harm's way.

However, the most remarkable thing that I learned was just how protected throughout his life he seemed to be, by what many people thought must be Divine intervention! Many of our Founding Fathers were well-known for writing about religion. Washington, however, was not as forthcoming about his beliefs, and his faith is described as strong yet subtle.

We know that Washington read the Scriptures and led prayers at General Braddock's funeral, when Braddock was mortally wounded fighting the French and Indians in 1755. We also know that Washington specifically asked Thomas Paine to read aloud his newly written essay, to stir the troops on Christmas night 1776, when many of them were dying of disease and starving. Paine strongly believed that God supported the American cause as Washington undoubtedly did.

What followed was a battle that turned the tide of the Revolution, and Paine's moving speech reads like a battle prayer:

"These are the times that try men's souls. The summer soldier and the sunshine patriot will, in this crisis, shrink from the service of his country; but he that stands by it now, deserves the love and thanks of man and woman. Tyranny, like hell, is not easily conquered; yet we have this consolation with us, that the harder the conflict, the more glorious the triumph. What we obtain too cheap, we esteem too lightly: it is dearness only that gives everything its value. Heaven knows how to put a proper price on its goods; and it would be strange indeed if so celestial an article as freedom should not be highly rated."

In his own writings, Washington talks of God's protection over him. He describes in a letter to his family that he had remained alive thus far because of "the miraculous care of Providence." He seems to be expressing some of his own disbelief that he had remained unhurt. He was certain that the formation of the country was to be under God's direction, saying: "I have only been an instrument in the hands of Providence."

Word spread of Washington's miraculous survival throughout the colonies and even a famous pulpit preacher took notice. Samuel Davies, a notable religious leader at the time, stated, "Providence has hitherto preserved him.....for some important service to his country."

Further confirmation came in the 1770's when two different Indian chiefs testified to having personally missed killing Washington, even though he was singled out and specifically targeted. Both chiefs swore that they never were known to miss, and that Washington must be protected by the Great Spirit. Years later, one chief traveled a great distance to meet him, stating that he had "come to pay homage to the man who is a particular favorite of Heaven, who can never die in battle."

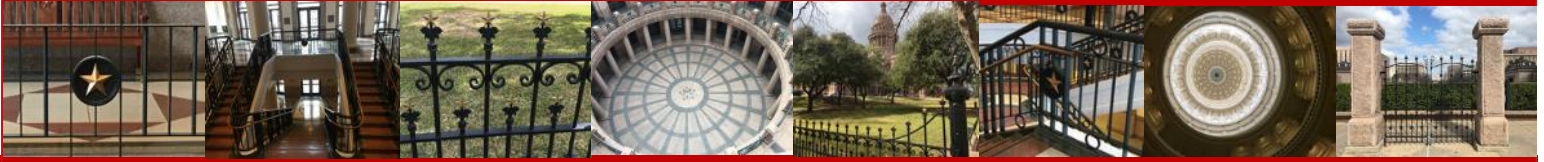

A **Democrat** non-believer wants any mention of God and religion silenced.

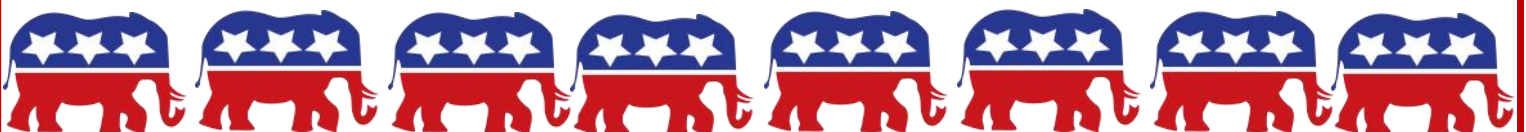
If a **Republican** decides he needs health care, he goes about shopping for it, or may choose a job that provides it.

YOUNG AMERICA'S FOUNDATION

Earlier this month, Jim and I were invited to a Young America's Foundation (YAF) reception and banquet which kicked off the weekend's student conferences in Dallas, Texas. Over 320 students were registered for this event and they were in attendance as well. Herman Cain was the speaker for the evening. I have been a long-time supporter of YAF and have attended other events here in Dallas in the past. Kathy Ward and her husband Michael Wiseman went with us as our guests. We were all so encouraged by the stories that those young people who now work for YAF told us about how they came to be involved with this organization. One of the young people we met was Grant Strobl, Chairman of Young Americans for Freedom which was founded on September 11, 1960, at the home of William F. Buckley Jr. I have included at the end of my article, Grant's rather interesting story. After attending this event, I wanted to share more about YAF and encourage everyone who reads this to consider supporting this great organization.

As stated earlier, YAF was founded in 1960, and in 1962, YAF spearheaded the "Rally for World Liberation from Communism," hosting 18,500 conservatives at Madison Square Garden in New York City. This event was one of the largest conservative events in history. And also in 1962 Ronald Reagan joined the YAF National Advisory Board, eventually becoming YAF's Honorary National Chairman- a relationship that would last for more than forty years.

What eventually came to be Young America's Foundation began at Vanderbilt University in 1969 when a group of students started an organization called University Information Services (UIS) to provide students with conservative ideas that were missing from their educations. (As you can see, even back in the sixties, colleges and universities had more and more liberal professors.) By 1971 UIS had become a national organization and was renamed Young America's Foundation. The goal of bringing conservative speakers to campus remained and the Foundation launched a nationwide effort to share the Conservative Movement's greatest minds and voices with student audiences to provide intellectual balance.

By 1974 the Foundation had expanded its activities by sponsoring a nationally syndicated radio program featuring California Governor Ronald Reagan. Also in 1974, foundation leaders, Frank Donatelli and Ron Robinson, established the Conservative Political Action Committee (CPAC) which hosted newly elected President Ronald Reagan at the 1981 conference's annual banquet. And that same year President Reagan began the tradition of hosting Young America's Foundation annual summer student conferences (now the National Conservative Student Conference) at the White House each year of his Presidency.

In April of 1988, Young America's Foundation acquired the Reagan Ranch (also known as Rancho del Cielo) with the blessing of the Reagan family and in 2001 the Foundation acquired the 217 State Street in Santa Barbara which became the Reagan Ranch Center. In 2007 the Foundation hosted the inaugural Reagan Ranch High School Conference at the Center to teach young people about the principles and life of President Ronald Reagan. The Foundation has been hosting the conferences for both high school and college students ever since.

Young America's Foundation and Young Americans for Freedom become one united YAF in 2011 with Young America's Foundation being the parent organization. I hope this you will visit www.yaf.org to learn more about this great organization.

Bringing conservative speakers to campuses have, sad to say, brought out protesters and at times these protests have become violent and destructive. But the left may be in for a shock according to an article by Allen West (<http://www.allenwest.com/matt-palumbo/campus-protests-stunning-result-liberals-never-saw-coming>) "...and as a result of the increasing cult-like nature of the Left on college campuses globally, students are making a right turn. According to The Telegraph: *With all this book-burning and platform-denying madness sweeping up much of the media's interest in campus culture, the gradual rise of another group of students has gone under-reported. British and American millennials and post-millennials - also known as 'Gen Z'- are warming to conservatism.*"

Elections are scheduled for Saturday, May 6 for:

- Plano City Council Members and Mayor
- Plano Independent School District Trustees
- Collin College Trustees

Early Voting Begins Monday, April 24.

- All Plano council members are elected by all Plano voters. It is confusing because some council seats require residency in specific districts - but all voters vote on all council seats.
- The Mayor is Place 6 and will be on the ballot. Special duties of the Mayor such as managing council meetings would be interesting to include.
- Past voting in city elections has been very low. The last election turnout was around 6%. The time before that was even lower. It is important to get people to vote in city elections.
- PRW's March meeting will be a forum for Plano council candidates. Invite people to attend and meet the candidates. There will be a candidate meet & greet at 11 am before the forum begins.
- The city election is May 6 - other dates such as last day to register and when early voting begins would be good to include.

Protests against President Donald Trump, some peaceful and others destructive, continue to be exuberated by the media. The most recent ones are protests against Trump's travel restrictions on several countries dominated or infiltrated by radical Islam. The courts ruled that Trump's travel restrictions do not meet legal requirements. However, street protesters claim that Trump's travel restrictions are anti-Islam, or racist, or pro-fascist or pro-Nazi, or all of above. For analysis of such claims let's go to recent history.

Throughout the Cold War (1946-1988) the United States had entry restrictions on the refugees from the communist countries. Refugees were white, Christians, anti-socialists, and politically incorrect. The vetting process of issuing visas was time intensive and averaged about two years. Candidates for visas had to prove they were not members of the communist party or any communist dominated organization. In addition, each and every candidate had to have a sponsor to guarantee the candidate would not be on welfare programs.

Unlike the refugees and street protesters today, the immigrants from Eastern Europe and Russia, as well as the American public, appreciated this vetting process. Most of refugees considered the entry to be a privilege rather than a right. No-one wanted a few "comrades" to slip into the United States. Moreover, the refugees from communism adjusted to the life in America. For example, the entire order of the Cistercian Priests came from Hungary to Dallas in 1956. Within two years, they started a college prep school, which is one of the best in the region.

Throughout the Cold War years, no public protests against restrictions on the entry of refugees from the East occurred and no claims were heard of travel restrictions being anti-Christian or anti-white, or anti-Russian, or anti-Polish, etc.

Entry restrictions from communist controlled countries yesterday and those at risk for radical Islam today have the same objective: to protect U.S. citizens from terrorism and to safeguard our formal and informal institutions from alien doctrines. Still, we observe a difference in public reaction.

I conjecture that the rise of *political correctness* in the U.S. is a major cause of those differences. Political correctness has roots in the three movements that dominated Europe in the last century: communism, fascism and nazism. Like those movements, political correctness tolerates no disagreements and shows disdain for the rule of law.

From communism, political correctness absorbed the usefulness of naming all people who hold different political and social views as fascists. Indeed, a major trait of public protesters is the character assassination of those who disagree with them. From fascism, political correctness learned the importance of incorporating all pro-collectivist groups, by force if necessary, into a rule by men. Thanks to political correctness, the likes of Elizabeth Warren and Bernie Sanders have hijacked the party of Truman and JFK.

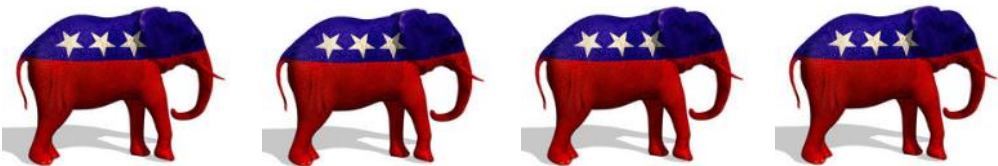
