# Update from the SUP HUB Working Group meeting on 17th April 2024 at the Redcliffe Hotel

#### **PaddleUK Update from Brendon**

Brendon had a meeting with PaddleUK on the 17<sup>th</sup> to show them around the bay in the sunshine. The bids for these elite sporting events are all in place and we are awaiting a decision. If these proposals are funded properly and accepted by the governing bodies in SUP, Torbay will host the UK Nationals 2024-2028, World Grand Prix in 2026 and World Championships in 2028.

#### **Surprise announcement from Carolyn Custerson**

Carolyn presented some facts about tourism in the Bay, and explained the Destination Management Plan for Torbay, and its key theme "On the Water". The SUP HUB concept integrates into the destination management plans perfectly, and she pledged financial support for the 2024 UK National Paddleboarding competition event. Furthermore, she announced that this investment would be equally matched by Torbay Council, marking a significant advancement in positioning the English Riviera as the Paddleboarding Capital of the UK.

#### **Community and commercialisation**

Discussions centred around understanding and meeting tourist preferences. From creating SUP-friendly accommodation, Après' SUP dining offers to training and safety, the focus was clear: enhancing paddleboarders' experiences is essential to attracting more demand to The English Riviera. The prospect of marketing paddleboarding holidays in The English Riviera as "SUP-friendly adventures" garnered enthusiastic responses. Proposals included adopting 'SUP-friendly' amenities for accommodations, signposting to nearby SUP rental facilities, and generating tourism demand through water activities.

#### Preview of the Sup Hub digital map

A key takeaway was the preview of the crowdsourced digital map, 2024 SUP HUB map, kindly assembled by John at Lumm Paddleboards and Jan Tribble from Kay Elliott Architects. Suggestions were put forward for making this map more inclusive of local knowledge, businesses, and safety information.

This ambition opened a call for volunteers passionate about translating this digital innovation into a printed map that can reach even wider audiences.

#### Conservation of protected species and places

Conservation efforts, especially concerning the seal populations were discussed, highlighting the need to educate the public on respecting the places where wildlife need protection.

## Accessibility for all

The theme of accessibility was strongly advocated for, with suggestions such as providing beach wheelchairs and ensuring basic facilities are available to all. Concerns were voiced about how to sustainably fund these initiatives, leading to a broader discussion on setting industry-wide standards for paddleboarder-friendly accommodations and services.
