So, now what? We know that Moses had to come down from the mountain, and we have to leave here and go back to our 'ordinary' lives. But that's just it, isn't it? Being women of faith, gifted already with four plus decades of living - we know that nothing about this life is ordinary. For each one of us, it is all extraordinary and it is all unique – your journey is different than mine, and

different than the person sitting next to you, and even different from where you *thought* your journey was headed last year, or maybe even just last week.

The purpose of a Conference like this is to take a timeout, using the most precious and limited resource we have - time – to listen and continue growing in our relationship to Christ.

Based upon the reflection we just did, take out a sheet of paper and write down ONE THING you are taking from here that will impact your life when you return home. There are probably many things, but for now, just choose one. If you're not sure yet, just commit to spending more time in prayer at home to LISTEN to what God is telling you.

You don't need to share what you wrote down with anyone, but keep that sheet of paper - perhaps post it on a mirror or on your bedside table as a reminder.

On page 46 of her book, "Making Room for God", Mary Sperry tells us: 'Avoiding the near occasion of sin means staying away from people, places and circumstances that tempt us into the behaviors that we are trying to purge from our lives.' I guess a natural extension of that would be 'to grow in holiness I need to surround myself with people, places and circumstances that feed my desire for holiness' – well, I guess we've all been in the right place for that.

You don't leave an experience like this unchanged. You may not see the change right away, but keep praying with your hands open, and God will show you how and where he wants you to step out with HOPE.
