Report on the Audit of Standalone Ind AS Financial Statements:

We have audited the accompanying standalone financial statements of M/S. RARE EQUITY PRIVATE LIMITED ("the Company"), which comprise the Balance Sheet as at 31st March 2025, the statement of Profit and Loss, including the statement of other Comprehensive Income, the statement of cash flow and the Statement of changes in Equity for the year then ended, and notes to the standalone financial statements, including a summary of significant accounting policies and other explanatory information.
