July 17 - Official Ballot Dropboxes Open

July 21 - Mail Ballot Packet

Look for your Primary Election ballot packet to be delivered in the mail.

July 27 - Voter Service Centers Open

Voter Service Centers are open through Election Day for same day registration and accessible in-person voting. Visit our website for locations and hours of operation.

August 8 - PRIMARY ELECTION DAY

Voted ballots must be received by 7:00 p.m.

GENERAL ELECTION

October 14 - Official Ballot Dropboxes Open

October 16 - Mail Ballot Packet

Look for your General Election ballot packet to be delivered in the mail.

October 20 - Voter Service Centers Open

November 3 - GENERAL ELECTION DAY

ELECTIONS 2026

Who Can Register to Vote:

- **A Citizen of the United States**

Non-U.S. citizens, including U.S. Nationals, do not qualify.

- **At least 16 years of age to pre-register**

(must be 18 years old to vote)

- **A resident of the State of Hawaii**

Residence is not simply because of presence in the state, but is acquired with the intent to make Hawaii your legal residence.

To check your voter registration status, visit www.olvr.hawaii.gov with a valid Hawaii Driver's License/Hawaii State ID, or call our office.



Absentee Voting

If you will be away and need a ballot sent to a temporary address, fill out the green Absentee Application and submit by Aug. 1st for the primary and Oct. 27th for general election. Visit our website or call our office for assistance.

Hawaii Votes by Mail:

All active registered voters automatically receive their ballot by mail.

Because Hawaii is a vote-by-mail state, no traditional polling places will be established!



Election Dates:

Primary Election: August 8, 2026

General Election: November 3, 2026

Voting by Mail:

- **Cast your vote in comfort**

Follow the instructions on your ballot, mark it carefully, and ensure you sign the return envelope.

- **Returning your voted ballot**

By Mail: Place your voted ballot in the mail using the postage-paid return envelope. Please use a dropbox if it is 5 days before the election.

By Ballot Dropbox: Drop your voted ballot at a dropbox location within your county. For locations and hours, visit www.mauicountyvotes.gov

- **Track your ballot**

Displaced Lahaina Voters
