DAY 1

WEEK 2 – WALK IN THE WORD

JAMES 1:22–25 (KJV)

DOERS OF THE WORD

ROOT THOUGHT – NO MORE “MIRROR MOMENTS” WITHOUT CHANGE

James says hearing the Word without doing it is like looking in a mirror and then forgetting what you saw. The Word shows us what's out of place—but it also invites us to respond. Being a “doer” doesn't mean performing perfectly; it means responding honestly. When the Spirit puts His finger on something, a doer says, “Yes, Lord—help me obey here.” The blessing is not just in the hearing—it is in the doing.

- Read James 1:22–25 (KJV) out loud once.
- Read it again, slowly, and picture the hearer and the doer.
- Mark or circle in your Bible: doers of the word · hearers only · deceiving your own selves · a doer of the work · this man shall be blessed

CARRY THIS PHRASE TODAY

DAY 2

WEEK 2 – WALK IN THE WORD

LUKE 6:46–49 (KJV)

BUILT ON THE ROCK

ROOT THOUGHT – OBEDIENCE IS YOUR FOUNDATION

Jesus paints two houses: one survives the storm, the other collapses. The difference isn't whether they heard Him; both did. The difference is that one did what He said. Storms don't invent your foundation; they expose it. When you practice obedience in the quiet, everyday moments, you are "digging deep" long before the flood ever rises. Your life becomes anchored, not in your feelings, but in what He has spoken.

- Read Luke 6:46–49 (KJV) out loud once.
- Read it again, slowly, and picture the two houses.
- Mark or circle in your Bible: Why call ye me, Lord, Lord · doeth the things which I say · digged deep · rock · flood · vehemently

ROOTED OBSERVATIONS

WHAT I SEE

Write what this scripture says about those who hear and do versus those who hear and do not.

WHAT I NOTICE

Write what you notice about the foundation, the storm, and the outcome for each house.

WHAT IT REVEALS ABOUT GOD

ROOT CHECK

- Where in my life has the Lord been asking for obedience, not just “Lord, Lord” on my lips?
- What storm am I facing (or expecting) where I need a deep foundation on His Word?
- Is there a hard thing Jesus has said that I’ve been avoiding because it feels costly?

DAY 3

WEEK 2 – WALK IN THE WORD

JOHN 15:7–8 (KJV)

ABIDE AND BEAR FRUIT

ROOT THOUGHT – FRUIT COMES FROM STAYING, NOT STRIVING

We often want fruit, answered prayer, visible change, spiritual growth without the quiet, hidden work of abiding. Jesus ties fruitfulness to two things: abiding in Him and His words abiding in us. Abiding is staying, not sampling. It looks like returning to Him again and again, letting His words shape your thoughts, prayers, and expectations. When His Word lives in you, your desires begin to align with His heart, and your prayers flow from that place.

- Read John 15:7–8 (KJV) out loud once.
- Read it again, slowly, paying attention to the words abide and my words.
- Mark or circle in your Bible: abide in me · my words abide in you · ask what ye will · bear much fruit · so shall ye be my disciples

ROOTED OBSERVATIONS

WHAT I SEE

Write what this scripture says happens when you abide in Christ and His words abide in you.

WHAT I NOTICE

Write any connections between abiding, answered prayer, fruitfulness, and discipleship.

WHAT IT REVEALS ABOUT GOD

Write what this shows about the Lord's desire for you to be fruitful and close to Him.

ROOT CHECK

- Have I been more focused on fruit I can see than on abiding I can't measure?
- Where do I feel burnt out from striving instead of strengthened by abiding?
- What is one way I can make space for His words to "abide" in me, not just visit?

SOAK WITH THE SCRIPTURE

TODAY'S PHRASE TO SOAK IN:

"If ye abide in me, and my words abide in you..." (John 15:7, KJV)

WHAT STOOD OUT

Write the word or phrase that gently pulled you back to abiding—abide, words, fruit, ask, disciples.

WHAT I HEARD

Write what you sensed the Lord saying about staying with Him and letting His words stay in you.

"If ye abide in me, and my words abide in you..." (John 15:7, KJV)

SURRENDER RESPONSE

CONFESS

“Lord, I surrender my need to see fast fruit. Teach me to abide in You and to let Your words abide in me. Shift my focus from striving to staying, from results to relationship. Make my life fruitful in a way that glorifies the Father. In Jesus’ name, Amen.”

WALK IT OUT

Choose one phrase from John 15:7–8 (for example, “my words abide in you”).

Return to it three times today—morning, midday, and evening—and whisper it back to Him.

CARRY THIS PHRASE TODAY

I choose to abide in Christ and let His words abide in me today.

DAY 4

WEEK 2 – WALK IN THE WORD

1 THESSALONIANS 2:13 (KJV)

THE WORD THAT EFFECTUALLY WORKS

ROOT THOUGHT – THE WORD IS WORKING IN YOU

Paul commends the believers for receiving the Word “not as the word of men, but as it is in truth, the word of God.” That Word did something, it effectually worked in those who believed. You may not feel dramatic change day to day, but when you receive God’s Word as His very voice and mix it with faith, it is actively working inside you. It confronts lies, grows faith, and reshapes desires—even when you don’t see it yet.

- Read 1 Thessalonians 2:13 (KJV) out loud once.
- Read it again, slowly, and notice how they received the word of God.
- Mark or circle in your Bible: received the word of God · not as the word of men · truth · effectually worketh · in you that believe

Write any first thoughts, phrases, or questions below:

ROOTED OBSERVATIONS

WHAT I SEE

Write what this verse says about how the word of God was received and what it does in believers.

WHAT I NOTICE

Write any contrast between the word of men and the word of God.

“...the word of God, which effectually worketh also in you that believe.” (1 Thessalonians 2:13, KJV)

WHAT IT REVEALS ABOUT GOD

Write what this shows about God's desire for His Word to work powerfully inside of you.

ROOT CHECK

- Have I been treating Scripture more like human advice or like the voice of God?
- Where have I doubted that the Word is actually doing anything in me?
- What specific promise or command have I heard but struggled to believe?

“Lord, I choose to receive Your Word as truth, not as the word of men. Forgive my unbelief where I have doubted its power in me. I believe that Your Word is effectually working inside me, even where I cannot yet see it. Strengthen my faith to agree with what You have spoken. In Jesus’ name, Amen.”

WALK IT OUT

CARRY THIS PHRASE TODAY

The word of God is effectually working in me because I believe.

DAY 5

WEEK 2 – WALK IN THE WORD

HEBREWS 4:12 (KJV)

THE LIVING, POWERFUL WORD

ROOT THOUGHT – LET THE WORD DO HEART SURGERY

The Word of God is not dull, passive ink on a page. It is alive and powerful. It reaches places no one else can touch, dividing soul and spirit, judging thoughts and the intents of the heart. Sometimes that feels uncomfortable. The same Word that comforts also confronts. But every cut He makes is the cut of a skilled Physician, not a cruel critic. When you allow His Word to search you, He is not shaming you. He is healing you.

- Read Hebrews 4:12 (KJV) out loud once.
- Read it again, slowly, and pay attention to every description of the word of God.
- Mark or circle in your Bible: quick · powerful · sharper than any twoedged sword · piercing · discerner of the thoughts and intents of the heart

ROOTED OBSERVATIONS

WHAT I SEE

Write what this verse says the word of God is and what it does.

WHAT I NOTICE

Write what you notice about how deeply the Word sees and divides within you.

ROOT CHECK

- Is there an area I've kept "off limits" from the searching light of God's Word?

SURRENDER RESPONSE

CONFESS

“Lord, Your Word is quick and powerful. I surrender my defenses and invite You to search my heart. Where Your Word cuts, let it also heal. Reveal what needs to change, and give me grace to respond in obedience. In Jesus’ name, Amen.”

WALK IT OUT

Pray before reading: “Lord, let Your Word search me and heal me today.”

As you read, note one place where you feel pierced, exposed, or deeply seen, and respond: “You are right, Lord.”

CARRY THIS PHRASE TODAY

I welcome the living, powerful Word to search and heal my heart.

“For the word of God is quick, and powerful, and sharper than any twoedged sword...” (Hebrews 4:12, KJV)

DAY 6

WEEK 2 – WALK IN THE WORD

2 TIMOTHY 3:16–17 (KJV)

THOROUGHLY FURNISHED BY SCRIPTURE

ROOT THOUGHT – THE WORD EQUIPS YOU FOR EVERY GOOD WORK

Scripture is God-breathed and profitable, for doctrine, reproof, correction, and instruction in righteousness. The goal? That the man or woman of God may be perfect, thoroughly furnished unto all good works. That means there is no assignment, calling, or season that His Word cannot prepare you for. Where you feel under-qualified, under-equipped, or unsure, the Lord is not embarrassed by your lack. He invites you back to His Word to furnish you.

- Read 2 Timothy 3:16–17 (KJV) out loud once.
- Read it again, slowly, and notice every purpose of Scripture.
- Mark or circle in your Bible: given by inspiration of God · profitable · doctrine · reproof · correction · instruction in righteousness · thoroughly furnished

Write any first thoughts, phrases, or questions below:

ROOTED OBSERVATIONS

WHAT I SEE

Write what this verse says the Scripture is profitable for.

WHAT I NOTICE

Write what you notice about being perfect and thoroughly furnished unto all good works.

“...that the man of God may be perfect, thoroughly furnished unto all good works.” (2 Timothy 3:17, KJV)

WHAT IT REVEALS ABOUT GOD

CONFESS

“Lord, thank You that all Scripture is inspired by You and profitable. Forgive me for wanting comfort without correction, and blessing without instruction. I surrender my sense of inadequacy and receive Your Word as my equipment. Thoroughly furnish me for every good work You have prepared for me. In Jesus’ name, Amen.”

WALK IT OUT

Ask: “Lord, what Scripture are You using to furnish me for this?”

Look up a verse related to that area and write it as your “equipment” for today.

CARRY THIS PHRASE TODAY


READ & REMEMBER

- Then look back over the scriptures from this week and remember what you have heard from the Word.






