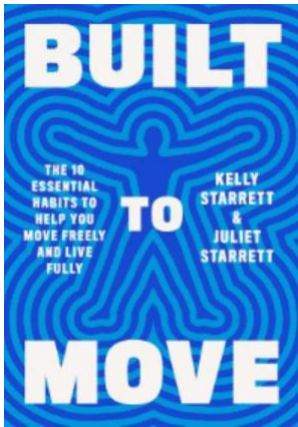
Some people need killing: a memoir of murder in my country / by Patricia Evangelista
