
How to share an egg: a true story of hunger, love, and plenty / by Bonny Reichert

The traitor of Arnhem: the untold story of WWII's greatest betrayal and the moment that changed history forever / by Robert Verkaik




Locked in: Dept. Q #10 / by Jussi Adler-Olsen

Cold iron task: Unorthodox chronicles #3 / by James J. Butcher




The songbird & the heart of stone: Crowns of Nyaxia #3 / by Carissa Broadbent

In the descent to the underworld, a bride of the sun must choose between the light of her redemption... or a dark love that defies the gods themselves.




The jackal's mistress / by Chris Bohjalian


Witness 8: Eddie Flynn #8 / by Steve Cavanagh


Nobody's fool: Detective Kierce #2 / by Harlan Coben


A very bad thing / by J.T. Ellison

She'll do anything to uncover the truth of her parents' murder--even work alongside the man who once broke her heart.




I cheerfully refused / by Leif Enger


The summer guests: Martini Club #2 / by Tess Gerritsen


The Bourne vendetta: Bourne #20 / by Brian Freeman

When his best friend crossed one of Evan Smoak's strict code he calls 'The Ten Commandments' he has no choice but to track and face down his only friend.






Kiss the girl: Meant to be / by Zoraida Cordova


Tangled up in you: Meant to be / by Christina Lauren


A map to Paradise / by Susan Meissner


Fight or flight / Fern Michaels


Been wrong so long it feels like right: King Oliver #3 / by Walter Mosley




Kills well with others: Killers of a certain age #2 / by Deanna Raybourn


Dead man's list: San Diego #3 / by Karen Rose


Cold reckoning: Avril Dahl #1 / by L.T. Ryan & Biba Pearce


Far from home / by Danielle Steel


The heart we leave behind / by Buck Turner


The long road back to you: Long road back to you #1 / by Buck Turner


The secrets of good people / by Boo Walker
