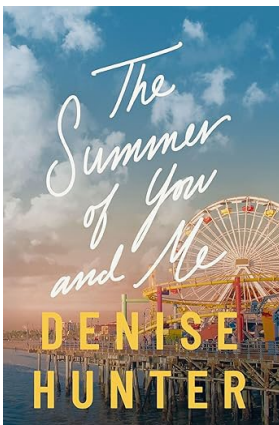
Before we were us / by Denise Hunter

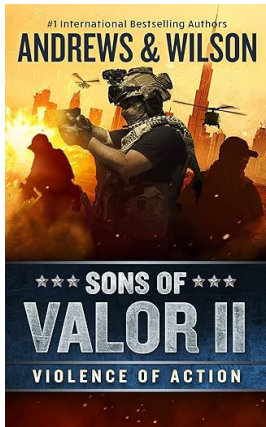
The summer of you and me / by Denise Hunter

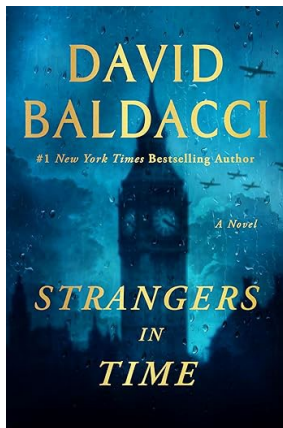
Violence of action: Sons of valor #2 / by Andrews & Wilson

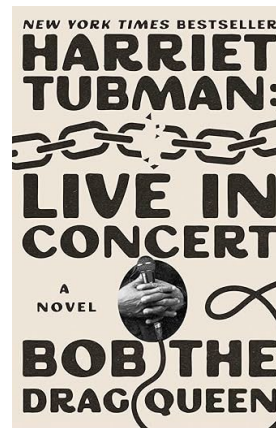

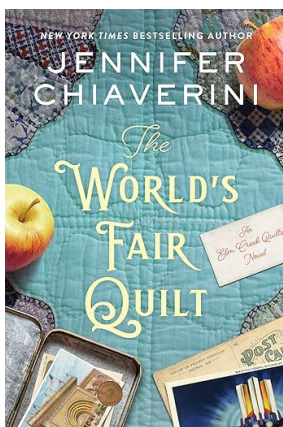

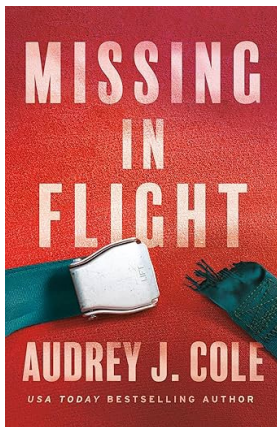
The world fair's quilt: Elm Creek Quilts 23 / by Jennifer Chiaverini

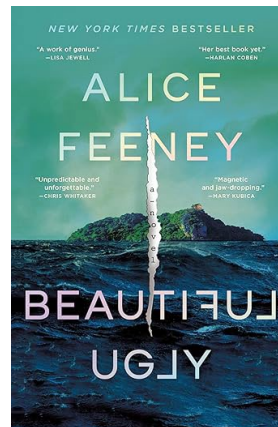
The last hunt: Final hunt #2 / by Audrey J. Cole

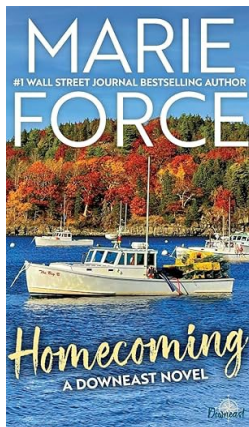
Missing in flight / by Audrey J. Cole

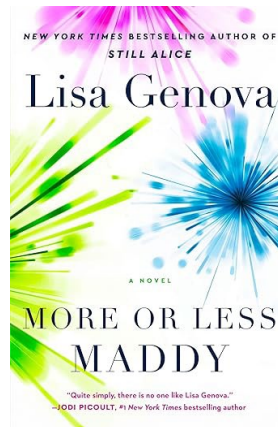
Beautiful ugly / by Alice Feeney

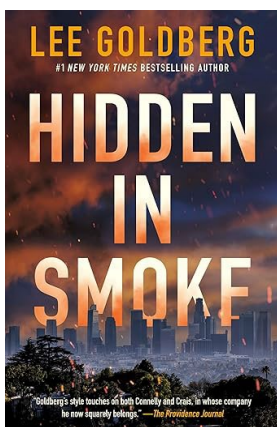
Homecoming: Downeast #1 / by Marie Force

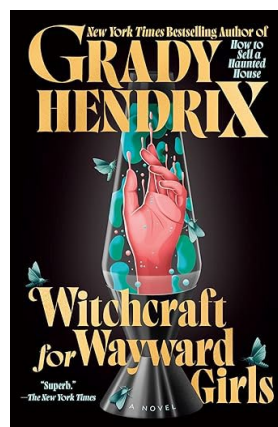
More of less Maddy / by Lisa Genova

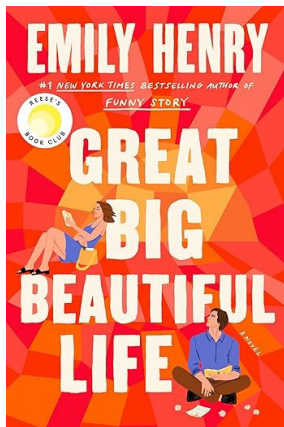
Hidden in smoke: Sharpe & Walker #3 / by Lee Goldberg

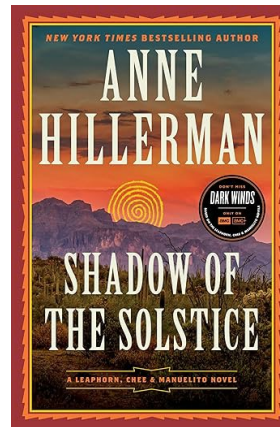
Witchcraft for wayward girls / by Grady Hendrix

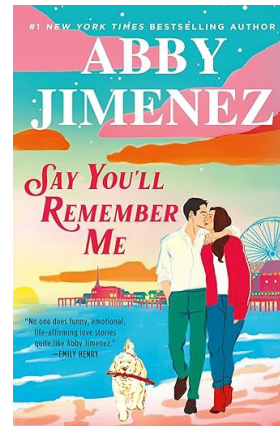
Shadow of the solstice: Leaphorn, Chee & Manuelito #10 / by Anne Hillerman

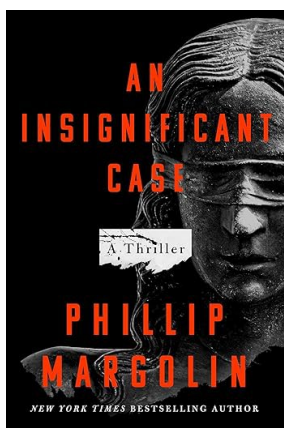
Overkill: Ali Reynolds #18 / by J.A. Jance

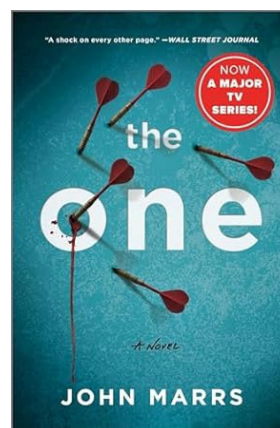
Say you'll remember me / by Abby Jimenez

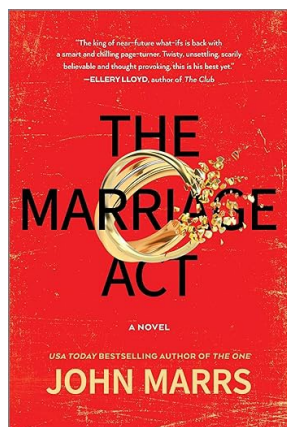
An insignificant case / by Phillip Margolin

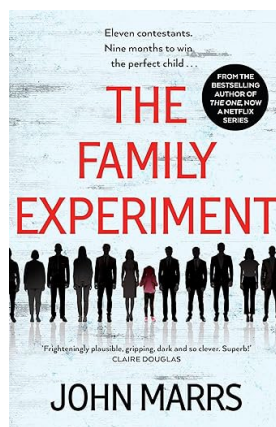
The one: Dark future #1 / by John Marrs

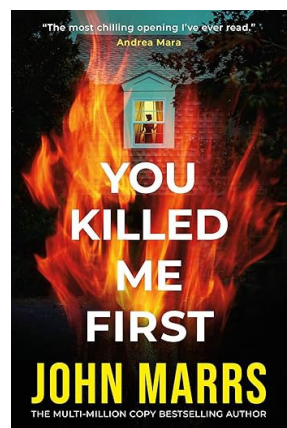
The marriage act: Dark future #2 / by John Marrs

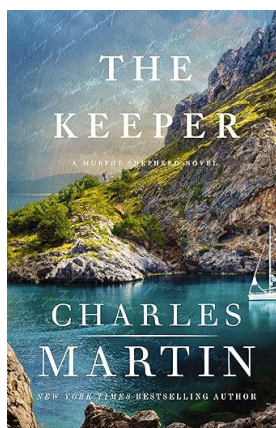

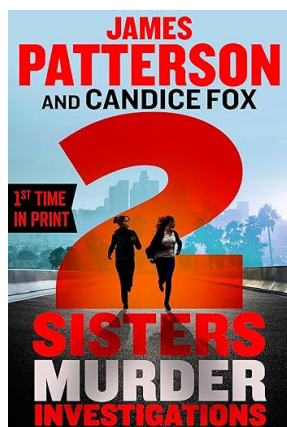

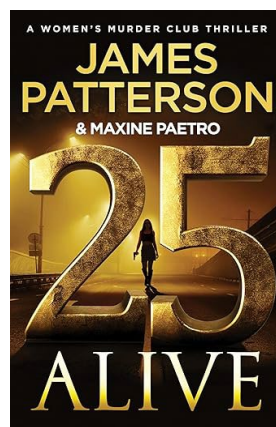
The keeper: Murphy Shepherd #4 / by Charles Martin

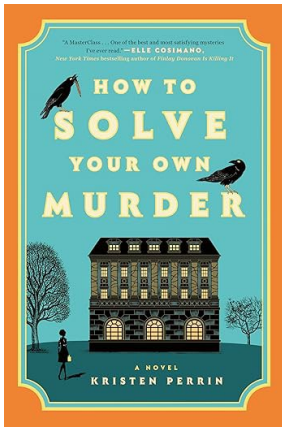
2 sisters murder investigation: 2 sisters detective agency #2 / by James Patterson

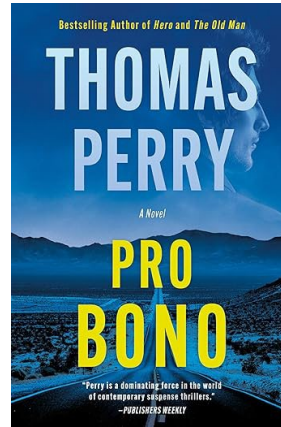
25 alive: Women's Murder Club #25 / by James Patterson

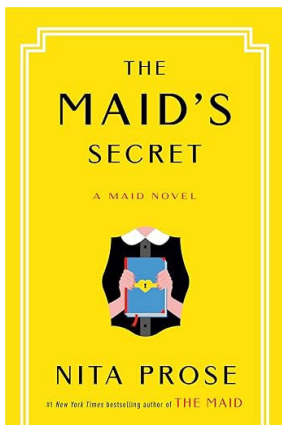
How to solve your own murder: Castle Knoll Files #1 / by Kristen Perrin

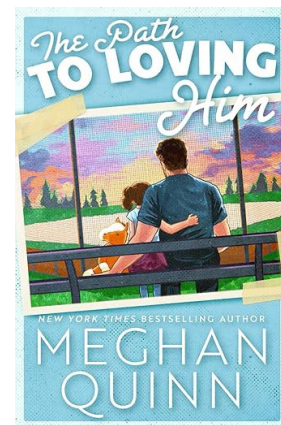
Pro bono / by Thomas Perry

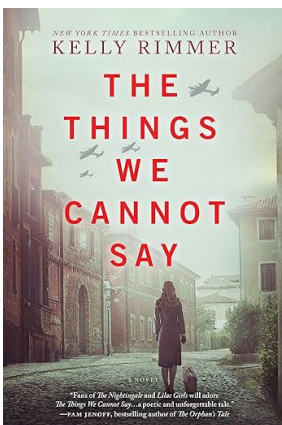
The maid's secret: Molly the maid #3 / by Nita Prose

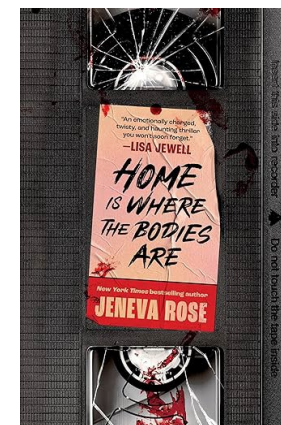
The path to loving him / by Meghan Quinn

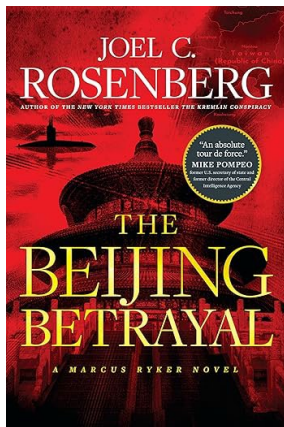
The things we cannot say / by Kelly Rimmer

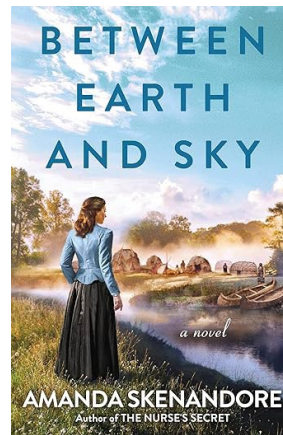
Home is where the bodies are / by Jeneva Rose

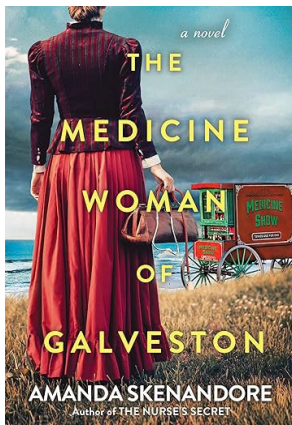
The Beijing betrayal: Marcus Ryker #6 / by Joel C. Rosenberg

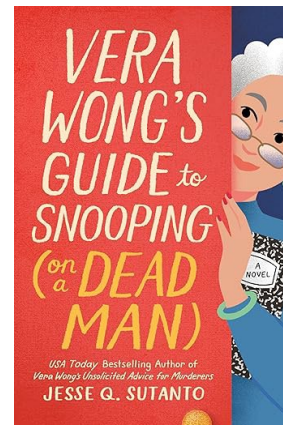
Between earth and sky / by Amanda Skenandore

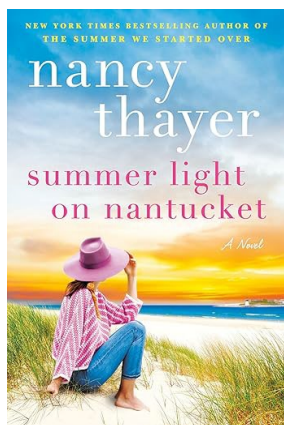
The medicine woman of Galveston / by Amanda Skenandore

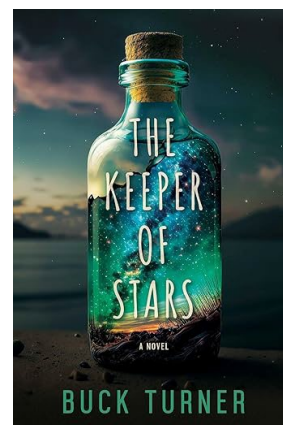
Vera Wong's guide to snooping (on a dead man): Vera Wong #2 / Jesse Q. Sutanto

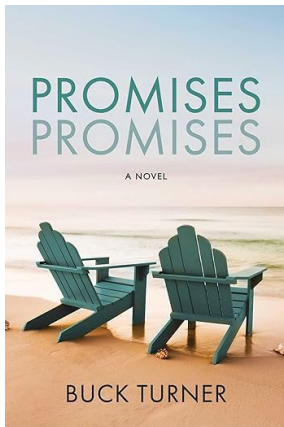
Summer light on Nantucket / by Nancy Thayer

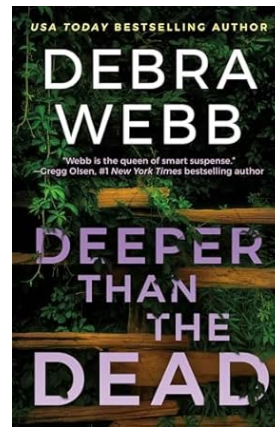
The keeper of stars: Keeper of stars #1 / by Buck Turner

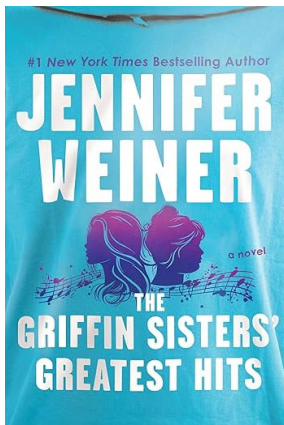
Promises promises / by Buck Turner

A sentimental romance about a woman who thought she had it all—fame, success, and wealth—until she attends her best friend's wedding and discovers her own chance at a happily-ever-after.



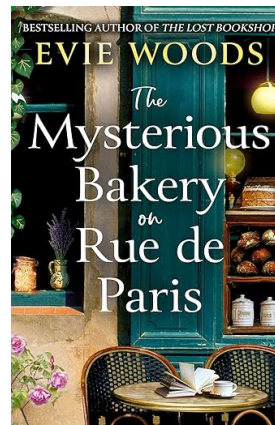
Deeper than the dead: Vera Boyer #1 / by Debra Webb

The Griffin sisters greatest hits / by Jennifer Weiner

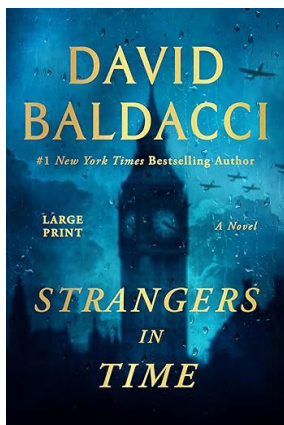

The mysterious bakery on Rue de Paris / by Evie Woods

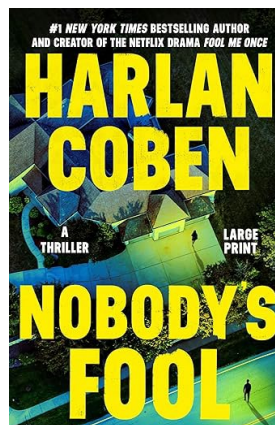
