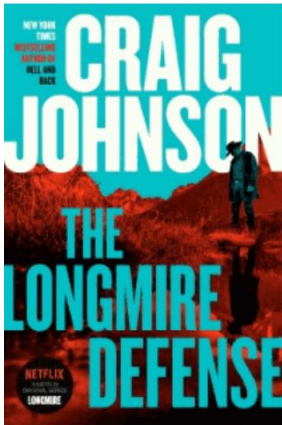
Juno loves Legs /
