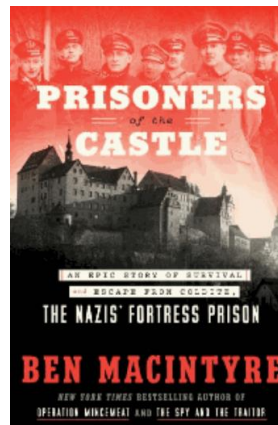
The mosquito bowl : a game of life and death in World War II / by Buzz Bissinger

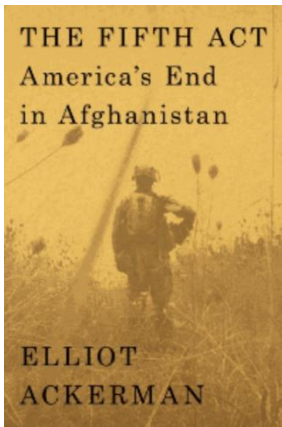
Black snow : Curtis LeMay, the Firebombing of Tokyo, and the Road to the Atomic Bomb / by James M. Scott

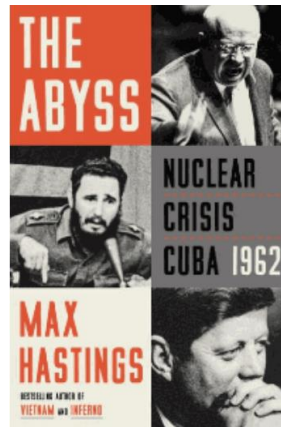
Prisoners of the castle / by Ben MacIntyre

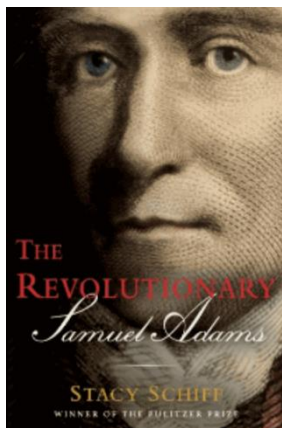

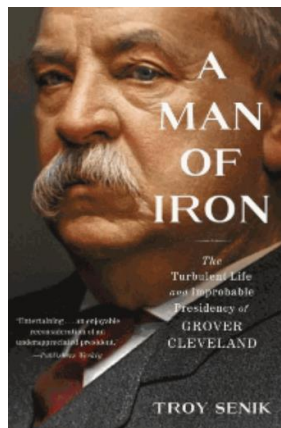

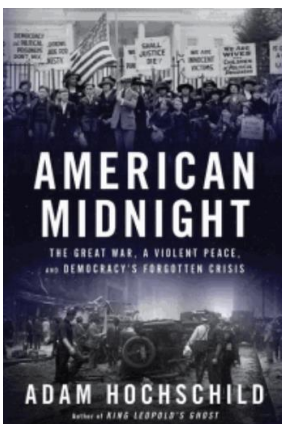
The revolutionary : Samuel Adams / by Stacy Schiff

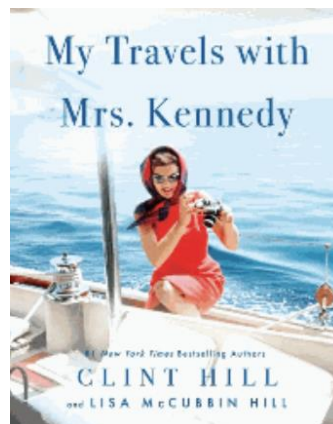
A man of iron : the turbulent life and improbable presidency of Grover Cleveland / by Troy Senik

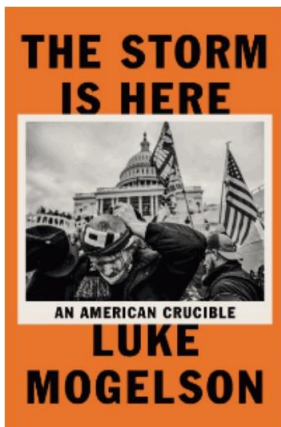

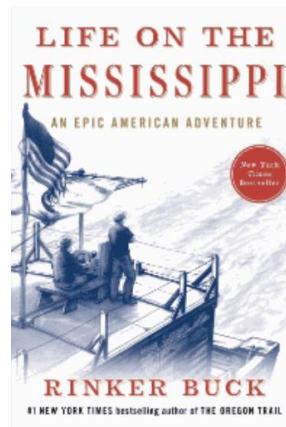

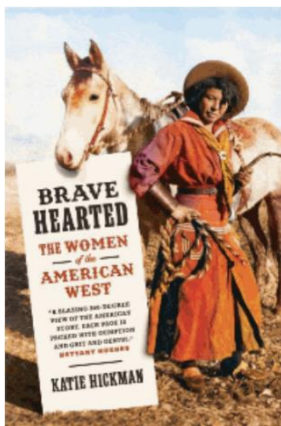
The storm is here : an American crucible / by Luke Mogelson

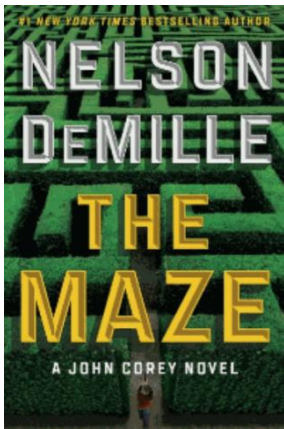
Charlie Parker 20

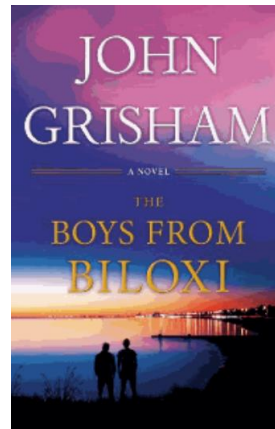

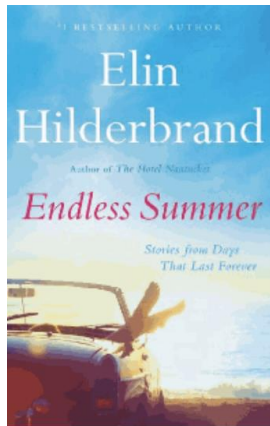


John Corey 8

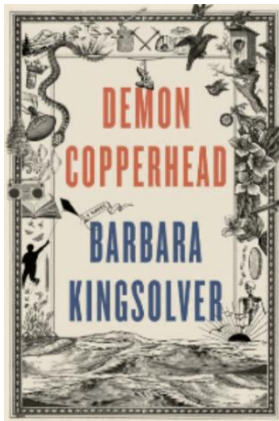

A witty and heartfelt story of two friends who unexpectedly find the person – and the place in which – they belong this Christmas.

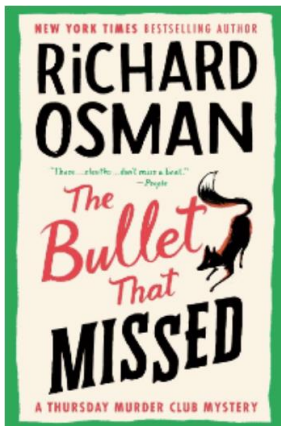
