In January 1942, Soviet press photographers came upon a scene like none they had ever documented. Dmitri Baltermants, a photo-journalist working for the Soviet newspaper *Izvestiia*, took photos that day that would have a long life in shaping the image of Nazi genocide in and against the Soviet Union. Presenting never before seen photographs, *Grief: The Biography of a Holocaust Photograph* shows how Baltermants used the image of a grieving woman to render this gruesome mass atrocity into a transcendently human tragedy.


