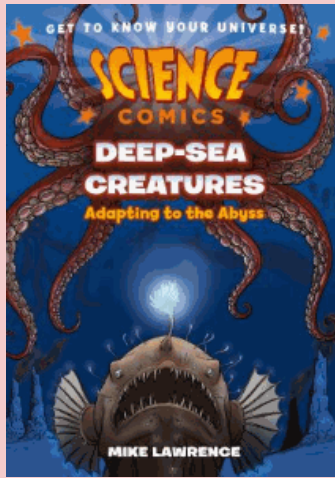

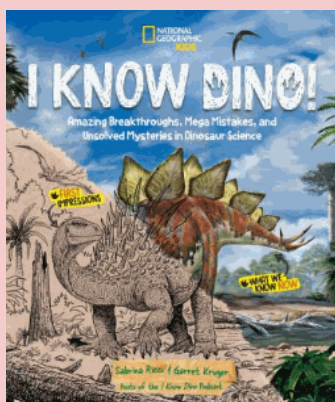
Deep-sea creatures adapting to the abyss

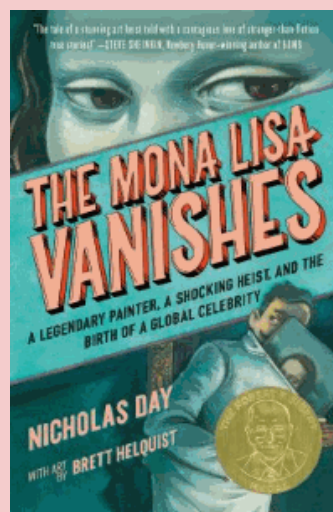
The floating field : how a group of Thai boys built their own soccer field

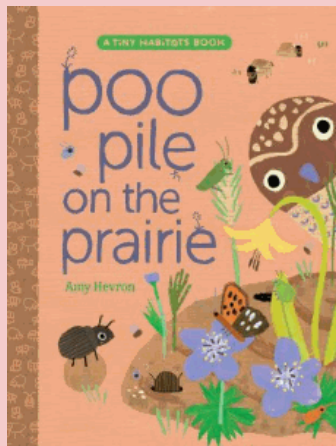
