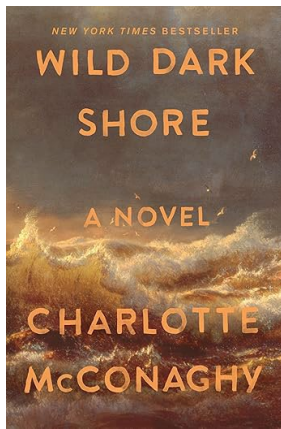
The laughing dead / by Jess Lourey – Steinbeck & Reed 3
