Agatha takes on the case of a gardener who died by poisoning, which was written off by the police as an accident caused by the consumption of weed killer stored in a rum bottle.




Austin homicide detective Jordan Poe is hunting a serial killer she fears is the same man who assaulted her sister, Avery, two years ago.






Charlie Parker 19








Practical magic 4




Blood ties: the Logans I




Karen Pirie 6




Tattooist of Auschwitz 3
