JANUARY/FEBRUARY/MARCH DAY RIDES

Don't miss out on the first MBE ride of the year at Salinas River Beach in Moss Landing. Arrive early for Mimosa's and Danish's. Ride time will be 11am. February will host our Presidents Ride & BBQ at the Santa Cruz County Horsemen's Showgrounds. Camping available for those who wish to attend from a distance. More details to come as we get closer. March 11 will be a day ride at Calero Park in South San Jose. This ride is subject to change depending on the weather. Calero closes if there has been too much rain so keep an eye out for an alternate plan if that happens. March will also include our first campout of the year at McCormick Ranch in Santa Maria, March 16-20. The McCormick's have done a great job developing a horse camp with corrals, trees for hi-line, group bbq area, bathroom and showers, water for horses, wash basin and plenty of room for camping. You can either ride the McCormicks private 260 acres and adjacent 500 acres, or the ranch is also adjacent to 1800-acres in the Los Flores Open Space with groomed hiking/equestrian trails.

RIDE TIME: Ride time 11am if you would like to ride with a group, or you can ride on your own. Arrive early for champagne and mimosas with ride hosts Erika Reid and Kathy Madlem. Bring your own lunch and chair to visit following the ride.

ADDRESS: 10721 Potrero Rd., Moss Landing.

DIRECTIONS: FROM HIGHWAY 101: Take Highway 101 to CA-156 West. Follow CA-156 W to CA-183 N/Merritt St in Castroville. Turn right onto CA-183 N/Merritt St. Go to end and make slight right onto CA-1 North. Go approximately 1.8 miles and turn left onto Potrero Rd and go to the end of the road.

DIRECTIONS: FROM SANTA CRUZ/WATSONVILLE: Take Highway CA-1 South. Turn right onto Potrero Rd and go to the end of the road.

The Potrero Road entrance to Salinas River State Beach is on a strip of land between the Old Salinas River and the Pacific Ocean. This is the central entrance to the state park. The sandy beach here is long and wide and backed by dunes for most of its length. From the parking lot a trail meanders south in the dunes to the southern parking lot of the Salinas River Beach at the Monterey Dunes Entrance. A wider path leads north from here all the way to the northern entrance near Moss Landing Harbor. **HORSES** are permitted to access the beach only by the designated routes and to ride only on the wet sand below the high tide, to protect wildlife and vegetation. Horses are also permitted on the designated equestrian trail. Owners are required to clean up after their horses in the parking lot. Manure and straw should be shoveled into the horse trailer and not thrown into the dunes.

Dogs not permitted on beach or dunes.










Thanks to the huge success of the 2022 Gambler's Ride & Casino Campout and the sponsors who supported the event, we were able to award \$5000 in donations to horse related causes (we still have \$320 to donate if anyone has any suggestions).



\$180 Teton Raptor Center – requested by Peggy O'Connor to install covers over pit toilet flutes to avoid the many birds who fly into them and get stuck and die. Peggy will be arranging to have 2 covers at Eagle Meadows and 2 covers at Skillman Horse Camps.

\$500 Marin Stables and Trails Non-Profit – requested by Rebecca Larcher, Ann Raab & Tracy McDermott to be used for historic preservation and trail maintenance.

\$500 Santa Clara County Park Grant Ranch Horse Camp – Requested by Kathy Madlem who will purchase 3 heavy duty wheelbarrows and poop forks at the horse camp. Currently there is only 1 large steel wheelbarrow for everyone to use.

\$500 Horse Sense Education and Advocacy – Requested by Debra Means for general horse care needs and feed.

\$500 Sonoma Equine Rescue Rehab & Adoption – Requested by Melisa Brown for equine needs such as feed, vet, farrier and utilities to run the facility.

\$1000.00 Divine Equine Assisted Therapy Center – Horse care, vet bills, feed, equipment, for therapy horses.

\$1500 Equine Rescue Center (ERC) – Requested by Kathy Madlem for equine needs such as feed, vet, farrier for horses unable to be adopted out due to behavior issues or age and live out the rest of their natural lives at the center.

PLEASE NOTE: All events are MEMBERS ONLY unless otherwise specified.

"Open" Events are MBE sanctioned campouts and non-members are required to sign a waiver to attend and be covered under MBE insurance.

MBE RIDE RULES

- 1. For your safety and pleasure, we ask that you use common sense, and show courtesy and consideration toward others at all times.
- 2. Please leave sick horses at home. Any horse with a noticeable cough, runny nose, or any other potentially communicable illness will be asked to leave.
- 3. If your horse kicks, indicate with a red ribbon on its tail.
- 4. For safety reasons, organized day rides will be paced at a walk.
- 5. Respect our lands and stay on designated equestrian roads/trails.
- 6. Keep one-horse length between you and the other riders, and a two-horse length on narrow trails and hills.
- 7. Do NOT pass the leader of a ride if there is one.
- 8. Ask permission to pass a horse in front of you and pass quietly.
- 9. If leaving the group during a ride, advise the ride host or leader.
- 10. Horses should not exceed a flat-footed walk in camp or in a staging area.
- 11. No loose horses are permitted in camp or on the trails. Hobbled horses are considered loose horses due to their tendency to travel.
- 12. Wherever MBE goes, dog rules must be followed. Dogs are NOT allowed on group day rides. When in camp, dogs and other pets must be confined or leashed. Owners are responsible for their own pets' behavior.
- 13. Animals are not allowed in eating areas.
- 14. Do NOT litter. Carry all trash to a trash receptacle.
- 15. Follow any park/camp/facility rules as set forth by location of ride/campout.
- 16. No alcohol or firearms permitted on the trail.
- 17. Smoking is permitted ONLY in designated areas.
- 18. Just a friendly reminder that we have ride rules for a reason. We would like to respectfully ask everyone to please follow the rules for you own safety and to ensure everyone's enjoyment. Ride Hosts do not want to be the bad guy and ask members to please follow the rules. We thank you for your consideration and diligence in following these rules.
