"Did you save me the chipped bowls?"




Uncooked rice! Squashed tomatoes! Broken biscuits! Smelly fish! Chipped bowls!







## **Woof! Woof!** Snacks for the dogs






### A note on feeding neighbourhood animals

*If you decide to share food with the animals who live near your home, you need to think about some things.* 

- Ask yourself if you can feed animals over a long stretch of time.

- Choose an open space away from other people's homes.



- Feeding just once a day will help street animals keep the ability to hunt for their own food.

- If you are going to take care of animals, make sure that they are healthy. Call the local animal hospital to give them vaccinations.

- Some animals and birds such as pigeons, monkeys, or mice can become pests because of feeding, so do not feed them!

- Water is just as important as food, especially in the summer! A clay pot will help keep the water cool.

- Avoid oily, salty, sweet or spicy foods.
