1. The proposal of Integrated University Township: Union Budget 2026-27, Govt. of India

The Union Budget 2026–27 announced a central government initiative to support states in establishing **integrated university townships** near major industrial and logistics corridors across India. These hubs are designed to co-locate universities, colleges, research centers, skill development units, and residential zones to bridge the gap between higher education and employment.

The Indian government is planning to establish **5 university townships** near major industrial and logistics corridors across the country, as announced in the Union Budget of 206-27. These 500-to-700-acre zones will integrate higher education, research centers, skill development, and student housing with nearby industries.
