Purchasing groceries to keep the pantry stocked while being restricted on what you can buy has been a little difficult as well. However, your faithful support has kept supplies coming in, limiting any disruption to

our ability to serve and provide for the families we assist.

Our old building in downtown Red Oak sold. We are working towards the plans for a new building here on our current property to provide more space for the Thrift Store. This will be another path to walk down but we know that God will provide the necessary funding as well as direction for this project. We want to be sure and plan for our current needs as well as more growth in the future. So many of you are asking where we are on this process. Until some of the construction material costs drop down to a more affordable level, we will wait so we can make the wisest use of our funds. The other issue we have is that we are now at max capacity here in the office and food pantry so we need to ensure we are ready for growth in that area as well. So, remember that whatever path you are on that God is with you. Also, always remember that we are so grateful to each and every one of you for your love, generosity, and compassion towards those we serve here at NECO. If your path seems more difficult than you can handle on your own, will you call us and let us pray for you? We would like to partner with you. Also, if while you are praying, God brings us to mind, will you stop and pray for us? We would so appreciate it!

Greetings from Client Assistance

Greetings wonderful community! So far this year The North Ellis County Outreach has been able to help 2,195 families with food in the amount of \$120,000 and assisted with financial needs of \$35,451.31. We were also able to help many of our clients with clothing for just under \$3,000.

We have had a large influx of calls for assistance due to some of the unemployment benefits ending. While many of our Senior Citizens have dropped from our Senior program, we have added several new Senior's and feel like that will increase through the winter months as well. The number of families on disability is staying pretty steady. We are also assisting some other families in our area we have never served before.

NECO is in need of more organizations and churches to partner with us for our Adopt a

Shelf program. Each organization "adopts" a shelf of items needed and delivers them to us. (Usually on a weekly, bi-weekly or monthly basis) This program is a simple way for the community to participate in helping our pantry stay stocked. If you are interested in being a part of this program, please give us a call so we can get you more information and get your church/organization signed up. I know that in my own, personal, experience, (my church participates in this program) the adopt a shelf program is very helpful because I know which item(s) my church has adopted. I can easily go grocery shop for those items and take it to my church to be dropped off or bring the items when we meet together.
