

May they - and all the faithful departed - RIP.

Last Thursday evening (Halloween) Fr Mebrate and I went - with a few young adults from our parish - to St George’s Cathedral for an event organised by [Southwark Catholic Young Adults](#). It was a gathering of people aged between 18 and 40 which involved prayer before the Blessed Sacrament accompanied by live praise and worship music. There was also the opportunity to go to Confession with 6 priests available in the Confessionals and in the side-chapels. Archbishop John also came to pray with the young adults and speak to them about his devotion to Blessed Pier Giorgio Frassati - a saint who lived in Turin at the beginning of the 20th century and died aged only 24. I wondered whether many would come with it being half-term, however, over 250 people were there with the priests being kept busy all night hearing confessions and it was inspiring to see the faith of the young who - instead of busying themselves with the superficiality of costumes and pumpkins - chose to make All Hallows Eve a time of drawing closer to Christ. In the reception afterwards I met people from all across the city who were grateful for the opportunity to learn about their new “friend in heaven” whom Archbishop John encouraged them to draw close to. He assured them that Blessed Pier Giorgio is an encouraging figure for his normality - his love of the things that we love; friendship and fun but also his simple devotion to Jesus in the Mass. All of us need encouragement in our faith and particularly within our culture in which the spiritual is so often forgotten and the person of Jesus Christ absent from our screens and headphones. Blessed Pier Giorgio didn’t allow himself to forget the Lord and made a priority of seeking him in daily Mass and prayer before the Blessed Sacrament. This is what led him to recognise Jesus in the poor of Turin who filled the city streets for his funeral. May his example lead us to never give up on holiness but seek to come closer to Our Lord in the Eucharist and the poor.
